### 1.1 MyGold

This is an AmigaGuide® file made by Christian T. Steigies.

Probably many other people have made something similar, but I haven't found anything on the net (yet). I'm going to write down my shortcuts, it would be very nice if some of you could tell me about the latest tricks and usages of the GoldED internal commands. I'm quite lazy in reading long docs, I wanna use it!

As I use GED for writing C sources, TeX text, emails,  $\dots$  I have defined several configs which are designed for the special purpose (i.e. the folder marks, WRAP and OVER mode,  $\dots$ ).

#### 1.3 shortcut

Beginning of a line CTRL-A End of a line myGOLD 2/3

```
CTRL-E
Transpose chars
CTRL-T
Convert a character to UPPERcase
CTRL-U
Convert a character to LOWERcase
CTRL-L
```

#### 1.4 CTRL-A: Jump to the beginning of a line ('Anfang')

To go to the beginning of a line, DOS computers have an extra key for this purpose...

```
Definition with internal commands: GOTO COLUMN 1
```

#### 1.5 CTRL-E: Jump to the end of a line ('Ende')

To go to the end of a line, DOS computers have an extra key for this purpose...

```
Definition with internal commands: GOTO EOL
```

#### 1.6 CTRL-T: Transpose chars

My favorite mistake when typing is to transpose two characters. That means I write 'teh' instead of 'the'. With this shortcut (which I saw implemented in another editor, whose name slipped my mind) its very easy to correct this mistake. Just move the CURSOR on the second character of the transposed chars (in this case the 'h') and press CTRL-T.

NOTICE: This one only works when you are NOT in the OVERwrite mode. Otherwise the character left of the cursor is deleted. If I knew how to check weather the editor is in the OVERwrite mode or not, this could be corrected.

```
Definition with internal commands:
MARK HIDE
MARK SET COLUMN
LEFT
BLOCK MOVE
RIGHT
```

### 1.7 CTRL-U: upper char

myGOLD 3/3

To change the character under the cursor to upper case

Definition with internal commands:
MARK HIDE
MARK SET COLUMN
BLOCK UPPER
BLOCK HIDE

#### 1.8 CTRL-L: lower char

To change the character under the cursor to lower case

Definition with internal commands:
MARK HIDE
MARK SET COLUMN
BLOCK LOWER
BLOCK HIDE
