1.2 Checkstart.guide/ins

Manual Installation
 ^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^

First you have to copy the config file into the 's' drawer on your 'sys:' partion. ←
 Then just place
 the main program anywhere you want, and run it from the startup-sequence.

Install program...
 ^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^

The install script copies the config file to SYS:c, and the main program to the ←
 Tools drawer in the
 SYS partion.

Remeber...
 ^^^^^^^^^^^

Make sure to add the line between the LoadWB and Endcli commands, i.e.

You must remember to start Arexx further up in the script.

NOTE: If you have a boot-up picture, you must make sure that its screen has been ←
 closed
 BEFORE CheckStart starts!! This is because CheckStart opens on the further ←
 most screen!

1.4 CheckStart.guide/Intro

What is it?

^^^^^^^^^^

Well, it is a small utility which should be used at boot-up. It checks the time, and if it is within given limits, starts a script of your choice. The idea came from a sysop who wanted his BBS to start on every boot up, but only if the time was within his opening times. It can of course also be used for other programs aswell.

You might say: "Why the hell can't I just add the program to my startup-sequence?". Well, let's say that you run a BBS and you want to play a game that requires a lot of memory, you would have to either close the program after boot up, or you could remove the line from your startup-sequence. Both ways are slow and akward.

If are using CheckStart, you could enable the 'Last chance' ...and if you press a button before 3 seconds has passed, the program will not start.

1.5 CheckStart.guide/req

What does it require?

It should run on every Amiga configuration, but you need WB2.0 to use the interface.

You will also need the Arexx programming language.

The XEN.font is required for the interface, this font comes from the MagicWB package.

1.6 CheckStart.guide/req

Configuring the bastard...

There are two possibilities; namely interface and config file editing.

The quick and dirty way is to use an editor to change the config file (CheckStart. ←
config), just load
it into your editor and change the options.

You could also use the interface, it is easier, and probably better for beginners.

Execute 'work:cd-rom

-----file end ←

Ok, let us start from the top:

INTERFACE: YES/NO

This option determines whether interface should be ON or OFF. If this option has ←
been set to
OFF, the interface will never reveal itself, thus making the program almost ←
invisible (no
interface visible to the user - CheckStart just does what you told it to do).

If set to ON, the interface will open no matter if a script is launched or not.

BETWEEN:xxxx
AND:xxxx

This is where you specify a range of time. If the current time is between the two ←
 given times, the ←
 script will be executed. The format is HHMM, i.e. half past six is 1830. You must ←
 remember that the ←
 two times given MUST be in the same day! If you want the time range to spread over ←
 more than a day, ←
 you have to use the OPTIONAL time range.

Here you can enter another time range, it is best used in conjunction with the ←
 first range, i.e. if a ←
 BBS is open from 19:00 one day to 07:00 the next, you should set the range to ←
 00:00 -> 07:00

This is very easy to understand. 'YES' will disable the entire program, 'NO' will ←
 make sure it runs.

LAST CHANCE: YES/NO

If YES, a small bar will appear giving you 3-4 seconds to press the close gadget, ←
 and thus avoid ←
 executing the script.

This is the Arexx command which launches the script. The argument is execute '< ←
 path>' - just write ←
 the path.

Using the interface...

The interface is pretty easy to use; just write the time in the boxes and use the ←
 'CD' button to ←
 find a script. - Remember to save before quitting!!! NOTE - make sure that there ←
 are no " ' " around the ←
 path before saving! I.e. work:start.script - and not - 'work:start.script'. Get ←
 the picture...?

Known problems...

The CheckBoxes will not show the options stated in the config file. I.e. the Last
Chance
option has 'YES' in it in the config file - the box in the interface remains
unchecked. Just
remember to check it before saving.

Editing the config file...

Please note that the box made of '*'s should always make a perfect square! If it ←
 does not, you know
 that there is a space in surplus. This must not happen, because then the program ←
 will not be able to
 load/save the options!

Font sensitivity...
 ^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^^

As I do not know how to make a program font sensitive, this program will force you ←
 to use the XEN.font,
 this is not really a problem, as most people have this font, but I am unable to ←
 control the font used
 for the title bar. This means that if you use a large font, e.g. if you have a ←
 graphics card running
 WB in a high resolution, it will 'eat' the space the gageets should have used! So ←
 try using a smaller
 font, like the XEN.font.

Saving from the interface....

When having chosen a long path name to the script and saving it, you should be ←
 aware that changing
 it to a shorter one will cause trouble. I.e. if the path was Work:scripts/start. ←
 script, you would
 if you changed it to Work:start.script, get something like this in the config file ←
 : Work:start.scriptt.script.
 This is because that it just overrides the thing that was there before and does ←
 not delete anything
 following it. You have to edit the config file to remove the unwanted bits.
