1.2 What's It All About?

Introduction

HotListHandler (HLH) will manage your hotlist!

My goal was to share one hotlist with all the browsers available for the Amiga.

HotListHandler 2 / 10

If you use more than one browser then use HotListHandler.

If you stick with one browser, well, use it anyway.

Install HLH and see why it is so useful.

Features:

- o A nice toolbar
- o Easy to use
- o Supports many browsers
- o Share one hotlist with different browsers
- o Offers a QuickMenu for fastlinks
- o Creates an index when viewing the hotlist through a browser
- o Grab URL's from browsers (if the browser supports it via ARexx)
- o Edit the hotlist while off-line (create groups, add URL's, etc.)
- o Jump to any public screen
- o Totally font sensitive
- o And many more.....

HotListHandler is Shareware, but is not crippled in any way.

Please Register if you are using it on a regular basis.

It is only a small fee for my work.

1.3 What does it need to run?

Requirements

You must be using an Amiga.

To run HotListHandler you need Amiga OS3.0+.

HLH can run as 'stand alone,' but you will find it to be more useful if you use a web browser;)

You must register this software if you use it on a regular basis.

1.8 How to make it work

Installation

Nothing terribly difficult.

An Installer Script is provided to simplify your life. After all, that's what computers are for, right?

The Installer Script will run under the Amiga's Install program.

Here is what the script will do:

Copy HotListHandler to a convenient place on your drive.

Set the HOTLIST tooltype in the icon if you like.

Run a script contained in the "Extras" drawer if it finds an AddToHotlist hotlist in your AWeb drawer.

After running the Installer:

Double-click the icon to run HotListHandler

A toolbar will appear at the top of your screen.

When you find that you cannot live without HLH then you must register .

1.9 How in the world...?

Usage

HotListHandler may be run from the Workbench or a CLI.

From WB, just double click on its icon.

You can set some tooltypes in the icon.

From the CLI, type the path (if necessary) and the name to start HLH.

HLH will also accept some CLI arguments.

Note that CLI arguments will override any tooltypes!

If you have been using my AddToHotlist program run the script in the "Extras" drawer to convert your AWeb hotlist to an HLH hotlist format.

When you start HLH a toolbar will open on the default or named public screen. If the pubscreen you have named is not open HLH will open on the default pubscreen.

Before the toolbar is opened HLH will try to read a hotlist. HLH can read AWeb's hotlist format. It will use a similar format when saving, so AWeb can always display the hotlist on it's own. Check the browsers page to see if you browser is supported by HLH.

Use the toolbar to open the various HLH windows.

When any HLH window is open you can access a menu.

When you see a URL you would like to add to your hotlist, open or move HLH to the same screen as your reader. It is then easy to copy or type in the link.

1.10 That funny looking thing at the top of your screen

Toolbar

After you have started HotListHandler a toolbar will open on the default public screen, or, if you have set the tooltype and/or provided a CLI argument, on the specified public screen. If the pubscreen you have named is not open HLH will open on the default pubscreen. See the menu page for information on jumping to another pubscreen.

The toolbar will adapt itself to the screenbar height and has five image buttons; presented here from left to right:

QUIT To quit HLH, you will be warned if any changes are not saved.

OPEN This button will open the main window.

QM Open a QuickMenu for fastlinks.

SHOW Tells the browser (if running) to show your hotlist. HLH will also create an index for it.

QGRAB With this button you QuickGrab a URL from a browser (if running and if the browser supports it). If no other window of HLH is open, or no group is selected, the URLs are placed in a buffer. Later you can place these URLs in your hotlist and edit them as necessary.

1.11 Oh, No! Not Windows!

Windows

Main Window Access the Main Program.

Quick Menu To bounce to an often used web page.

Edit Window Enhance and modify your HotList, edit your QuickMenu.

Buffer Copies and Cuts are stored here.

Menu When HLH is active, you have access to this with the right mouse button.

1.12 Where most of the features are found

Main Window

I think the HotListHandler buttons will speak for themselves and therefore I will not discuss them in detail.

+= This button will open the buffer window (see also QGRAB).

Up & Down buttons in the main window will allow easy rearrangement of your hotlist.

New will allow you to manually enter a URL.

Edit opens the edit window.

Remove You can not get back what you have Removed, the URL or group is lost after clicking Remove!

Cut & Copy place a URL in the HLH buffer, allowing you to select a group, or groups, to contain the URL.

Grab will grab the URL you are viewing and place it in the currently selected group.

Groups takes you up to the Hotlist Index.

About opens a standard Amiga requester.

Save to save your changes to disk.

Cancel to not save your changes.

1.13 The Fast way to GoTo a URL

QuickMenu

QuickMenu (QM) is a small window containing URLs which you have chosen to be (you guessed it!) quickly available, without having to go through the Groups in the Main Window or the browser's hotlist.

Clicking a name in the QuickMenu will tell the browser (if running) to go to this URL.

Remember it's a QuickMenu, one click on a URL is enough.

Click QM or the RMB to close this menu, or click another HLH window to close the QuickMenu.

Select or unselect the QM box in the edit window to control which URLs are contained in the QM.

1.14 How to modify your HotList

Edit Window

The Edit Window is reached from the Main Window.

The Edit Window is used to modify the Title or the URL, and to control the QuickMenu list.

Besides the standard Amiga gadgets the edit window has two text fields and four buttons.

Text:

Title so you can change the title of the URL which has captured your interest.

URL will allow you to keep up with the rapid changes of home page addresses.

Buttons:

QM will add or subtract this URL from your QuickMenu.

Accept will not close this window. This is very handy for adding new URL's or groups manually, as well as setting up your QuickMenu.

Accept & Close will do as stated.

Cancel will also do as stated.

Use the Main Window to SAVE your changes.

1.15 Where modifications are made

Buffer Window

The buffer window is accessed by opening the Main Window and clicking on the += button on the top right.

HLH's buffer is used to hold URLs which have been cut or copied from the Main Window.

It also holds URLs which have been grabbed via the QuickGrab button.

Multiselect is supported when choosing URLs in the buffer window.

After selecting at least one URL in the buffer window, you can copy or move them into any group you desire.

NOTE: The buffer window does not hold URLs which have been REMOVED!

1.16 The Top of the Screen

Menu

Project

About

Will open an Amiga requester containing information about HotListHandler.

Quit

Will quit HLH.

Settings

Browser Type

Using the menu you can set the browser type so HLH knows which command it has to use.

Note that HLH default settings are for AWeb.

Close on Follow

Toggle this on or off. When checked the HLH Main Window will close after a URL is double-clicked.

PubScreen

Choosing 'PubScreen' from the menu will present a submenu which includes all available pubscreens. It allows you to pick the public screen you want HLH to jump to.

This way you won't have to quit and restart HLH when you start and stop your browser. You can modify your hotlist and then run AWeb, or vica versa. This can also be handy when you are reading news or email.

1.17 How to Setup HLH

Tooltypes & Arguments

Currently only two tooltypes and arguments are supported.

HOTLIST=<path & name>

Default = AmiTCP: AWeb/aweb.hotlist

PUBSCREEN=<name>

Default = AWeb
