E : This is a Puyo. Pairs of colored Puyos constantly drop from the top of the screen. If they stack up to the top of the screen, you're toast!



To avoid that, you need to zap Puyos off the board. Make four or more touch, and they'll disappear. They don't have to line up—they just need to touch one another. (You can't use diagonals, though!) Puyos that touch "cling" to one another.

L: This little guy is Carbuncle. He'll watch over your game to make sure you play fair!

PuyoPuyo was a game originally developed by Sega/Compile on the Sega Mega Drive. It's one of the best Sega games out there, and if you can hunt it down, you can play it on a Sega Genesis with a small adaptor. Also, an Americanized version called "Dr. Robotnik's Mean Bean Machine" was just released by Sega of America. However, a game this good needed a Macintosh version! This version of PuyoPuyo was written and developed by me, John Stiles, and I owe special thanks to Phil Stroffolino for assistance in programming and debugging.

PuyoPuyo requires a Macintosh with 256 colors, a 68020 processor or better, and System 7.0. PuyoPuyo will refuse to run if your system doesn't meet these requirements.
