Motion Difference ChOp

FOR ADOBE PHOTOSHOP

This is a cool little trick that kind of expands on Kai's Snowy Mask (Power Tip #23), altough having read KPT #23 is not required. Again, you might want to have a good understanding of Channels before trying this.

- 1. In a new grayscale document, make some text, black on white, and copy it so it is in channels Black., #2, and #3.
- 2. In channel #2, use the motion blur filter at 0° and 30 pixels (less for smaller type).
- 3. In channel #3, use motion blur again, 30 pixels again, but this time at 90°.
- 4. Now use the Difference ChOp (found under Image>Calculate or Image>Calculations for ver. 3) with the following settings:

• Source 1: Channel #2

• Source 2: Channel #3

• Result: New Channel
