1) Why:

I don't know about you, but I use my computer in only one (human) language--English. And I'm willing to bet that you do too, albeit perhaps not English. So why do you have 150MB of localization files for the OS X operating system filling up your hard drive?

Enter Monolingual -- a handy utility for reclaiming your space for more useful things...like international mp3 files, email or whatever you like.

2) How:

To use Monolingual, you need to be an adminstrative user.

When Monolingual starts, you will be asked to choose the languages you wish to remove:

Once you have selected the ones you wish to delete, press the "Remove" button.

Unless you are logged in as "root", you will be asked to enter your administrator password.

You will then receive a warning to make sure you REALLY WANT TO DELETE the localizations files. Once you remove them, the only way to get them back is to reinstall Mac OS X.

That's it; pretty easy, huh?

- Q. What does this cost?
- A. NOTHING. Monolingual is freeware.
- Q. How is monolingual distributed?

A. Monolingual is distributed under the GNU Public License, which is included as the file COPYING.txt, and is also available (as is this README) via the Monolingual "Help" menu. If your copy of monolingual did not include it, you may find it at http://www.gnu.org/copyleft/gpl.txt
