- -Remove the annoying unmounting I'll be back dialog box.
- -Change names of some menu items. (For example, Empty Trash to Flush Toilet)
- -Add a Quit Menu so that you can quit the Finder.
- -Remove ZoomRects to speed up the Finder.
- —Get rid of the annoying rename delay.
- -Change the default alias suffix.
- -Change the Sleep and Hide Others/Show All Command keys.

The System 7 Pack! has been reviewed in MacUser, MacWorld, and user groups all over the world.
