Dynamic resource display (see how much of your system is available at a glance).

If you obtained PowerBar from a bulletin board you may have obtained the PBnnn.EXE file where nnn indicate the major and minor version number of this copy of PowerBar. To create the installation disk described above peform the following.

Insert a formatted diskette into your floppy disk drive that has at least 780Kb of space on the diskette.

Type "A:\" and hit the Enter key.

Type the full pathname of the PBnnn.EXE file and hit the Enter key.

The self extracting archive will now expand onto the A:\ drive and create the files listed above.

NOTE:

To install the PowerBar for Windows package, select the "Run" option from either Program Manager or File Manager and type "a:\setup". Then follow the on-screen instructions.

PowerBar can also be installed from a hard disk by running the "setup" program from the appropriate directory (expand the PBnnn.ZIP file described above into a temporary directory and then carry out install procedure).
