## Overview

**Advent98** is an Advent Calendar that plays a different Christmas carol each day. Larry Roberts has created beautiful arrangements of more than forty public domain carols. When you select the appropriate day from the **Advent98** screen, you will see that day's Bible verse accompanied by beautiful MIDI music. And **Advent98** lets you choose between the New International and King James Versions of the Holy Bible, as well as one Spanish and two German versions.

**Advent98** can also serve as a source of background music during your Christmas season, too; in its all-play mode, **Advent98** will play its songs randomly for as long as you wish.

**Advent** is an annual event—a new program will arrive each year. We plan several enhancements over the years, including displaying carol lyrics 'karaoke-style.' Please send us your suggestions to improve **Advent!**

## Minimum System Requirements

Microsoft **Windows NT, Windows 98** or **Windows 95**

256-color video

General MIDI device with Windows driver, including **Gravis UltraSound**

Note: computers without MIDI can still use **Advent98**; they simply will not be able to play any music. Similarly, 16-color video drivers will work, but the Advent scene will be ugly.

- 1 **Run SETUP** and follow the instructions on the screen.
- 2 **Start Advent98**—Select **Advent98** from the **PowerJam Systems** folder.
- 3 **Read the Overview dialog box's instructions** and you're on your way!

Upon registering, you will receive your personal Registration Information. **PowerJam Systems** strictly prohibits you from giving this Registration Information to anyone in any format whatsoever. Distributing this information would immediately void your license.

Registering enables access to the enhanced features of **Advent98**, including all play mode. See the **Advent98 Registered User Information** shortcut for details.

Please help us distribute **Advent98** as widely as possible (thanks!) by making sure all of your favorite bulletin boards have a current copy of the **official Advent98 archive** file. You may freely distribute **Advent98** as long as you include only the unmodified **Advent98 archive** file (i.e., the unregistered version) and you charge no money except for a maximum copying fee of \$10 US.

You are welcome to include the unregistered version of **Advent98** (i.e., the unmodified **Advent98 archive** file by itself) on your shareware CD-ROM collections, etc., as long as you notify us via e-mail that you plan to do so. Note that **PowerJam Systems** has a version tailored for CD-ROMs (i.e., it contains encrypted versions of the registered user files)—please e-mail us for details.

Finally, the help system contains a ready-to-print **Order Form** for all **PowerJam Systems** shareware programs. The Order Form also explains how CompuServe users can register **Advent98** online (program #4329).

# Advent98 Archive File

**PowerJam Systems** creates the official **Advent98** archive file by packing all necessary files into a maximally-compressed PKZIP 2.0 archive. We also use PKZIP's authenticity verification feature; this helps ensure that no one has tampered with the archive file that you download. And finally, we convert this ZIP into a self-installing EXE file using WinZipSE. When you 'run' the archive file, the process extracts the component files and then automatically runs the **Advent98** SETUP program.

Note that simply renaming the archive file does not cause any problems. In fact, many bulletin board systems prefer that the archive filename contains version information (e.g., AC98\_123.EXE for **Advent98** version 1.23). Thus, feel free to rename the archive file when you upload it, but do not add your own ZIP comments, do not add or remove any files, etc.—future downloaders have no idea what else, if anything, might have been tampered with. Thank you for adhering to this policy.

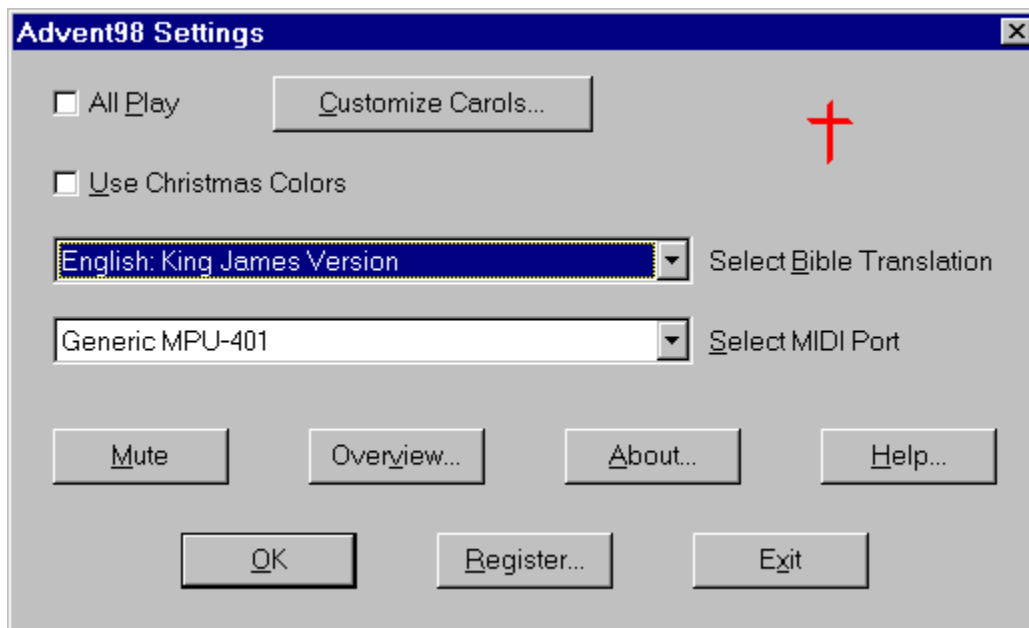
## Main Window / Settings Menu

**Advent98**'s main window consists simply of a Christmas-oriented picture (registered users can change this to any picture they like). This window is a 5x5 matrix that creates a 25-day Advent Calendar (one cell for each December day through Christmas). As you move the cursor through this matrix, its shape changes to note the underlying date. When it assumes the desired shape (e.g., '24' for Christmas Eve), simply left click to display that day's verse and play its carol.

**Advent98**'s menu does not normally display so as not to interfere with the Christmas scene. To display the menu, however, simply click the right mouse button whenever a Bible verse is not displaying.

**Advent98**'s menu consists of a **Settings** dialog box:



You can toggle All Play mode by selecting the **All Play** checkbox. All Play mode, available to registered users only, plays all songs (more than forty) in random order (i.e., like a huge record album). You can also [customize](#) the Album.

You can toggle the color motif by selecting the **Use Christmas Colors** checkbox.

You can select between several different versions of the Holy Bible via the **Select Bible Translation** combobox.

You can choose a MIDI output port via the **Select MIDI Port** combobox.

The **Mute** button stops the song (if playing) and sends "all notes off" and "reset all controllers" MIDI messages on each channel of the selected MIDI output port.

The **Overview** button (re)displays the startup screen that explains how to use the two mouse buttons in **Advent98**. Note that the registered version of **Advent98** does not display the Overview screen at startup.

The **About** button displays the sunglassed Beethoven trademark and plays the **Advent98** fanfare. Its purpose is to list copyright and program version information.

The **Help** button displays the [table of contents](#) for **Advent98**'s online help system.

The **OK** button closes the settings menu and redisplay the Advent scene.

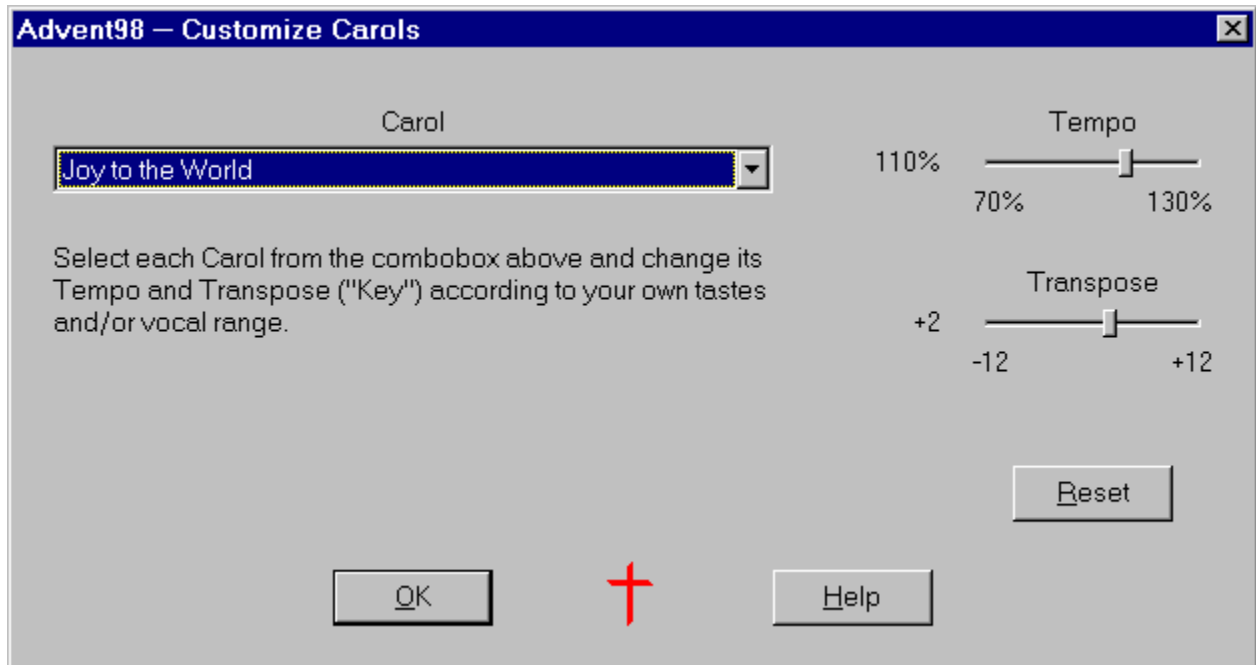
The **Exit** button terminates **Advent98**.

Note that **Advent98** has keyboard accelerators for *Mute* (Ctrl+M), *All Play* (Ctrl+P), and *Exit* (Alt+F4).

# Customize Carols

You can customize the tempo and transposition (“key”) of the carols to suit your taste and/or vocal range:



The title of each carol appears in the Carol combobox (unregistered users show only the first six carols). The songs are in ‘calendar order’—the first 25 appear in date order and the rest appear alphabetically. Choose the song you are interested in and then change its Tempo (between 70% and 130% of the default speed) and/or its Transpose (up to 12 semitones (one octave) above or below the default key). For registered users, **Advent98** stores these Tempo and Transpose decisions between sessions.



## Kiosk / Screensaver Mode

The registered version of **Advent98** has a "kiosk" (or "screensaver") mode (available in **Windows 98** and **Windows 95**, but not **Windows NT**). Similar to 'real' screen savers, this will allow you to enable access to the carols and Bible verses *without* risking your machine to hackers. Several users have told us the kiosk mode allows them to use the carols as Christmas party entertainment--they feel comfortable leaving the computer 'unattended' since access to sensitive data is password-protected.

Each time you enter or re-enter kiosk mode, **Advent98** will prompt you for a kiosk password. The kiosk password must be between 1 and 12 characters long and is not case-sensitive. In kiosk mode, you will need to enter the password before you can (a) switch to other programs, (b) display the **Advent98 Settings** dialog, or (c) exit **Advent98**.

When in kiosk mode, the program functions exactly the same as in non-kiosk mode except you cannot display the **Settings** dialog. Thus, you can still click on the picture to display a day's verse and play its carol; you can also continue to press the <Ctrl+P> accelerator to play all of the carols ("All Play" mode).

## Why a “Pre-Release” Advent98?

We released this preliminary version of **Advent98** in January 1998; it is essentially the same as the final version of the **Advent97**. The main reason we pre-released it was to let people know that there will be an **Advent98** closer to Christmastime. You are welcome to include the unregistered version of **Advent98** (i.e., the unmodified **Advent98 archive** file by itself) on your shareware CD-ROM collections, etc., as long as you notify us that you plan to do so (either via e-mail or a phone call). (We can ftp or e-mail the then-current version, too.)

We will resume working on **Advent98** in September 1998; new versions will continue to appear up until the calendar’s ‘start’ date of December 1. They will be available for download on several BBS throughout the world; definitely on those **BBS** listed in this help database, including **CompuServe**.

Depending on our day job workloads, the final release of **Advent98** will contain these features:

*Karaoke*—we might display the lyrics of each carol as they play.

*Languages*—we are always interested in showing the Gospel verses in new languages. Please contact us if you are interested in helping us translate the verses into your native tongue.

*Expanded Registration Pack*—we will probably have more songs and/or other files included.

**Note:** do not assume that any of these changes will make their way into the **Advent98** final release version.

## How to use Advent98 with your GUS

Because **Advent98** is not a patch-caching application, we have included a configuration file to use with the GUS Patch Manager.

To use the configuration file, open the Patch Manager, and in the 'FILE' menu, click on 'Load configuration...'

Change to the directory where **Advent98** is installed and load the file 'GUSINIT.PCF'

After this file is loaded, you may exit Patch Manager and start **Advent98**.

**Note that the patches used in Advent98 require 900KB of memory on your GUS, so you will need to have a full megabyte installed in order to hear all the instruments correctly.**

Because you may want to substitute your own patches for those which are standard from Gravis, we have included a full list of all the patches used below.

The carols used in **Advent98** were originally voiced for a Roland Sound Canvas, and some of the GUS patches are louder or softer than those on other synthesizers. Because of this, you *might* want to use the GUS program "Patchmaker" to change the volume level of individual patches. **Remember to save the original patch before you do this!**

2. 'Run' the archive by double-clicking on the filename (normally **ACGERMAN.EXE**).
3. If you installed **Advent98** into a folder other than **C:\PowerJam**, change the **Unzip To Folder** to that installation folder.
4. Click on the **Unzip** button.
5. Wait until the files unzip successfully and then close the main **WinZip** dialog box.

Thus, our software is not free--if you continue to use it after *30 days*, please register ("buy") the program. Please respect this--if too many people use our programs but do not pay for them, we will not be able to afford to continue to improve them. If you do not think the program is worth its registration price, please let us know why--we will see if we can satisfy you with the next version.

Registered users will be able to use the enhanced features of the program; they can also download free updates to the shareware version as it evolves.

Sorry, but because our bank charges us too much to process them, we can no longer accept checks drawn on banks outside of the USA. If you do not have a bank account in the United States, you can run the “registration” program that comes with all **PowerJam** applications, or you can order with **Visa**, **MasterCard** or **American Express** via our [web site](#).

You can register (“buy”) all *current* **PowerJam Systems** shareware programs with the attached order form. Registered users of the Shareware Edition of any program can access the enhanced features of and download free updates to the program(s). Lastly, your “please register” screen will go away.

Note that ordering diskettes and/or **User’s Guides** are optional. In fact, we encourage you to *not* buy the diskette, since you can always **download** the current version more cheaply and easily. Lastly, note that simply getting the \$5 disk alone does not cover the registration cost.

We currently have three shareware programs available for registration for 32-bit Windows platforms (*Windows NT, Windows 98 and Windows 95*):

**Advent98** is a General MIDI Advent Calendar for Christmas. Registered users of the **Advent97** can register **Advent98** for half-price.

**AxeBlaster** is an editor/librarian for Roland’s RD-600 digital keyboard.

**CanvasMan32** is an editor/librarian program for GS and Sound Canvas synthesizers. If you are confused whether you have **CanvasMan16** or **CanvasMan32**, select Help-About from the program’s menu—the About screen will tell you. Registered users of the Shareware Edition of **CanvasMan** can register **CanvasMan32** for \$20.

Note that none of the above programs work in Windows 3.1. However, **CanvasMan16** (the Windows 3.1 precursor to **CanvasMan32**), is still available via our [web site](#).

Note to **Advent** users: *if we receive a registration for an **Advent** program after January 1, we will apply it to that year’s program. For example, if we receive a request for **Advent98** on January 15, 1999, we will register the user for **Advent99** and not for **Advent98**. Please let us know if you disagree with this policy—however, we do not anticipate many registrations between January 1 and October 1. Note also that registered users of the prior year’s Advent program can register the current year’s program for half-price.*
