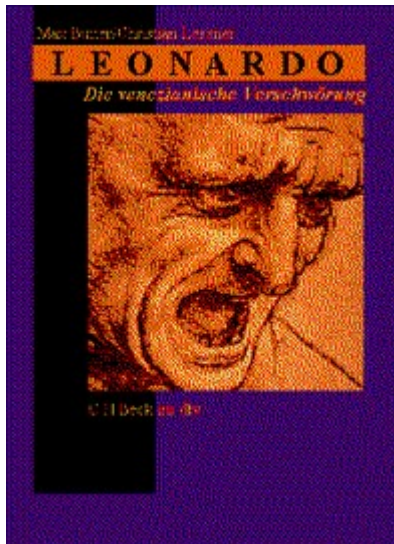

Driver Installation

Installation of the graphic driver

Though the Leonardo-Screensaver is able to work with a **16 color** graphic driver, the graphic resolution and therefor the graphical appearance will be achieved by using a **256 color** graphic driver.

But remember: More than 256 colors will slow your system down!

Salai

Gian Giacomo de Caprotti, which was his real name, came to Leonardo at the age of ten in 1490. He should have stayed with his master for 25 years. He worked as a servant in the workshop and managed his household. He was not skilled in painting. He was a thief and a liar, and he was stubborn. But Leonardo felt sorry about him, and he did not want to throw him out. He called him Salai, which means little devil.

Perpetuum Mobile

The Perpetuum Mobile (Latin: constant mobile) is an engine, that produces constant energy without an external energy input. The first axiom of thermodynamic says however, that such an engine is physically impossible.

Nevertheless the Perpetuum Mobile was searched for ages, in vain.



Setup - Program

Automatic installation

The *Leonardo-Screensaver* must be copied into the Windows-directory and configured by the Windows Control Panel. The added program **setup.exe** does all this automatically. Just follow these few simple steps:

1. Make sure that there is at least 1,4 MB of free disk space on your hard drive.
2. Insert the data medium, which contains the Leonardo-Screensaver files (disk or CD-ROM), into the corresponding drive.
3. Start Windows.
4. Select the command *Execute* of the menu *File* at the *Program Manager*.
5. Enter the command line **a:\setup.exe** (if your drive is A) at the dialog *Execute* and select **OK**.
6. Now the Leonardo Setup-Program starts running. The screensaver will be installed on your hard drive. During that a dialog box will be displayed, where you can see the copied files and the actual state of installation.
7. After having copied the files a window appears, which allows you to select a time (in minutes), after which the screensaver can be started. In addition you can configure or test the screensaver. Thereafter you can close the window by clicking **OK**.
8. Another window confirms, that the screensaver was correctly installed in your system and gives you information on the graphic adventure Leonardo, published in the edition *Beck Software in dtv*.



Screensaver Configuration

Configuration by the Windows Control Panel

Use this dialog box to configure the Leonardo-Screensaver.

The dialog box **Leonardo-Screensaver Configuration** contains the following options:

Info

- Press the INFO button for additional information about the graphic adventure Leonardo.

Screensaver Options

- Select the checkbox **Commercials**, if you want to see a short commercial of the graphic adventure Leonardo after every sixth scene.
- Press the **More Options ...** button to open the More Options dialog.

Password Options

- Select the checkbox **Password protection** to activate a password for the screensaver.
- Press the **Define Password ...** button to define a password for the screensaver. For additional information about how to change the password, press the **Help** button at the **Change Password** dialog.

Installation by the Windows Control Panel

To get an intermittent blank screen to increase the screensaver effect you may choose one of the following alternatives.

- never:** The screen is never blank.
- every 3rd scene:** After every 3rd scene the screen is blank for a short time.
- every 5th scene:** After every 5th scene the screen is blank for a short time.
- every 10th scene:** After every 10th scene the screen is blank for a short time.
- always:** The screen is always blank. This is equivalent to the screensaver *Blank Screen*, which is included in *MS Windows 3.1*. The *Leonardo-Screensaver* can additionally be protected with a password.
