Displays information about an X.400 recipient.

### **Display Name**

The name that is displayed in the Address Book.

**Given Name (g)** The recipient's first name.

**Surname (s)** The recipient's last name.

Initials (i) The recipient's initial.

#### Generation Qualifier (q)

The appropriate generation qualifier (for example, III or Sr.).

#### Common Name (cn)

The common name of the recipient. This can be a title, such as Director of Marketing.

#### **Organization (o)**

The organization name.

#### Org. Units 1 - 4

The names of more specific categories within the organization.

#### PRMD (p)

The private management domain name, which is the name of your company as specified by the X.400 service carrier.

#### ADMD (a)

The administrative management domain name, which is the name of your X.400 service carrier.

#### Country (c)

The name of the recipient's country.

#### To/Cc/Bcc

If you are composing a message, adds the name to the corresponding address box in the message.

#### Send Options

Displays the **Send Options For This Recipient Properties** dialog box, where you can specify the Internet encoding method you want to use on a per-recipient basis. For example, if you have the default for encoding set to Multipurpose Internet Mail Extensions (MIME) and you have one recipient whose e-mail system uses only uuencode, you can specify that this user receive all messages encoded in uuencode rather than MIME.

**Note** You must add the recipient to your personal address book (PAB) before you can specify special encoding instructions.
