

Home deskjet from HP

ewlett-Packard which decided to split in to two companies last month has announced another addition to its line of DeskJet printers with the HP DeskJet 880C. Marketed as the



replacements for the DeskJet 720C, this home printer is affordable and offers increased functionality and performance features such as USB and plug-and-play support, and HP's Photo Resolution Enhancement (Photo REt II) colour-layering technology for photo-

quality results on any paper.

Also, the 880C, with its capability to print 8 pages per minutes (ppm) in black and 5 ppm in colour claims to have a 25 percent increase in speed over its predecessor DeskJet 720C.

The Handout printing mode is said to condense up to four pages of text and images on to a single page, thus saving both time and paper.

DeskJet 880C allows poster printing—users can create large-sized prints by printing small segments of original images on single pages, which are then assembled into a large-scale poster.

Net on mobile phone



Nokia has announced what it claims is the world's first media phone based on the Wireless Application Protocol (WAP) in the Mobile Media Mode (MMM).

Dubbed the Nokia 7110, it allows users to access text information, like news, weather reports, stock prices, e-mail, flight schedules etc, available on the Internet on the phone itself.

According to the product release, the display area of this 141-gram phone is 80 percent larger than the 6110, even though

the overall dimensions are smaller. Apart from a built-in dictionary, the phone learns new words typed by you. It can store up to 1000 names in the phonebook (with about five phone or fax numbers and two addresses for each contact), while the phone, fax and e-mail address, among others, sport different icons each.

Other salient features include: Support for 34 languages and 35 ring tones, compatibility with the Nokia 5100 and 6100 series, and a standard battery, which under optimal conditions, gives a standby time of 260 hours and a talk-time of four hours and thirty minutes. Price of this product is not yet fixed, though the appropriate price has been given.

DRIVERS AND UPDATES

Speed up your CPU

Patches have always been synonymous with software. Using the patches listed below (and carried on the CHIP CD) you can improve the performance of certain operating systems on affected CPUs.

CPUIDLE4.ZIP

Keeps your CPU cool by running it at a lower power setting between cycles when it is not in use. Great for over clocking.

ENWA.EXE

This little program is for AMD K6. It enables 'write allocate' in systems where BIOS does not already do that. It only works under DOS, Win 3.1, Win 95. Run it automatically from your autoexec.bat and it will change the specific registers of the K6 to the correct values.

CTPPRO.ZIP

This patch is a must for Pentium Pro users. It programs the PPro internal Memory Type Range Register (MTRR) to increase video performance. It also enables the 'fast strings' of the PPro, which are usually disabled, due to a flaw of PPros with stepping 1. It enables the write buffers of the Intel Orion and Natoma chipsets.

FASTVID.ZIP

This patch programs the Pentium Pro MTRRs for frame buffer and VGA memory area to 'write combined' and enables write buffers of the Orion chipset.

Microsoft Office 97 SR1

Users with different versions of Microsoft Office 97 will now be able to share files with one another. This update includes the Word 6.0/95 Binary Converter for Word 97, which enables users to save files in the Word 6.0/95 native file format.

The Service Release also delivers enhanced support for POP3 and SMTP Internet e-mail in Outlook, the new Microsoft Access Snapshot, support for Intel's MMX technology, and various new viewers, converters and other minor enhancements and updates.
