### Can't fly? Glide

So you would want to fly, but don't know how to. Try paragliding. A paraglide is a foot-launched, ram-air, aerofoil canopy,



designed to be flown and landed with no other energy requirements than the wind, gravity and the pilot's muscle power.

It has all the paragliding information that a novice in India would need, right from the various locations, courses, and even flyer's experiences. There are places like Panchgani, Kamshet and Virar (in the vicinity of Mumbai) where you can drift with the wind.

The 'Basic' course teaches you launching and landing skills on

gentle nursery slopes, and then moves on to higher slopes, doing small hops and before you know it, you are flying! A little theory and flying practice later (five days), one can become a student pilot and could be all set to acquire a paraglider.

Paragliding enthusiasts can get in touch with Nirvana Adventures, the developers of

the site and organisers for the excursion programmes, through this site.





It enables students to participate in various underwater tasks that broaden their awareness of the environment and their capabilities as divers. And then there are the Core Dive, Night Dive, Deep Dive, Navigation Dive, from where you advance to the 'Rescue Diver Course' and 'Dive Mas-

ter Course' after which you are an accomplished diver free to explore the Andamans.
