
Users can also enquire about information regarding Human Resource

Chernobyl Virus Patch

If you have been unlucky and lost your data to the notorious Win95.CIH virus that attacked PC users recently, you have a second chance to be more careful with this CleanCIH update. Also known as Chernobyl, CIH, Spacefiller, or Win95.Spacefiller, the Win32.CIH virus infects 32-bit Windows 95/98 and NT files having the .EXE extension. When an infected program is run in a Windows 95 or Windows 98 computer, it infects the computer and becomes memory-resident.

On Windows NT, the infected program does not work properly. The memory resident virus now infects all the 32-bit .EXE files opened, quickly spreading to all files that are executed or copied. Depending upon the variant of the virus strain, the Win95.CIH virus has a dangerous payload that triggers on the 26th of any month. This virus can damage the contents of the BIOS flash memory chip.

The CleanCIH patch, which has to be run from the DOS prompt, cleans your PC of this virus.

Personal Web Server Security

Microsoft has released a patch for certain 'vulnerable' versions of its Personal Web Server running Windows 95/98.These versions allow unauthorised users to read files on the server if the name of the file is known or if the file is requested via a specific non-standard URL.

Users running Web Server products on Microsoft Windows NT are not affected. This vulnerability allows a file request that uses a non-standard URL to bypass the server's normal file access controls. The file must be specifically requested by name, so the requester would need to know the name of the file or correctly guess it. This vulnerability would allow files on the server to be read, but not changed or deleted, and would not allow new files to be written to the server. It also does not usurp any administrative privileges on the server. Although some of the affected products are provided as part of Windows 95 and 98, none are turned 'on' by default.

Canon India has introduced what it claims to be an 'Internet-optimised' printercum-scanner.

Called the BJC4310SP, the printer uses Image optimiser technology—the printer driver automatically smoothens out jagged edges of low-resolution images (eg, from the Net), to give you sharp outputs.

To use the BJC4310SP as a scanner, you need an additional LS22 scanning cartridge, which is not bundled with the printer. With this cartridge, the scanner can scan documents with images, illustrations and line diagrams at resolutions of up to 360 dpi in colour.
