## Tournament VIII Results

Congratulations to all who entered the Eighth International RoboWar Tournament. This was the largest tournament yet. The combined entry fees sum to \$205; each winner will receive a \$25 prize. The winners are:

The Eighth RoboWar tournament featured a multitude of excellent entries. Jean-Francis Lechat, of France, claimed the International title with three robots ranked in the top four spots. Delsevart placed first overall with a flawless pouncing algorithm first appearing in Tournament IV's "Full Nelson". The Artful Dodger, by Rob Williams, is the best implementation yet of a classic strategy and claims 3rd place overall. All of the Winner's Circle robots were excellent; watching them in action is an educational experience for robot designers. John Abbott, age 11, topped the list of youth contenders with his Superzot II. Doug Harris, Chemistry Nerd Supreme, reclaims his frequently held position on the Winner's Roster with the happy couple, Chlorinated Benzene Man & Woman. Finally, Mark Ramirez captured the Monty Python-loving hearts of the Icon Judges with Brave Sir Robin, who bravely runs away when danger rears its ugly head.

This tournament also marks the success of cooperative algorithms, exemplified by robots that don't fire unless shot at. Though the battles are boring to watch, these robots quickly rack up points when pitted against other cooperative 'bots, advancing them beyond their more aggressive counterparts in total ranking. For anyone who has studied evolution of cooperation in the Prisoners' Dilemma, watching the evolution of cooperation in RoboWar tournament entries should be a fascinating experience.

A number of other entries are worthy of special comment. Tim Seufert, another member of the original IEEE computer club that started RoboWar, is back in the trenches with a number of well-performing 'bots clipped out of a Calvin & Hobbes comic book. Ian Sudick also created a variety of solid performers, just a random number generator's whim away from claiming the team title. Josh Goldfoot, in his code for Duck, describes in great detail how to use the DOPPLER command. Browse his Skittish^3 code and enjoy Ginsberg's poetry as well! Some interesting sample robots appear in the Demos folder at

the request of their authors. Apologies to any nifty bots I may have forgotten to mention; there was just so much good work.

The Eighth Tournament was run on my new PowerMac 8100 using a beta version of RoboWar 3.2 running in native mode. Maximum performance when video was turned off is estimated to be around 750 chronons / second; hence all battles were executed 3 times and summed to reduce the randomness factor. RoboWar 3.2 should be released by the end of this summer.

Congratulations again to everyone who entered; the quality of entries was the best ever. Interrupts are being used in their full glory and the DOPPLER command has become essential to most good robots. The complete results of the tournament appear below: Authors under the age of 18 are italicized to give special credit to the rising generation of RoboWarriors. Sounds were striped from some robots before distribution to make reduce disk space requirements.
