Introduction

You've probably played pinball. You've probably played pong. But nothing can prepare you for 3D pinball!

3D Spinball is a great action-arcade game that requires you to think fast and move fast to survive. Your objective: Destroy all the blocks in the center of the screen, by causing the Spinball to collide with them. You must keep the ball from touching any of the four sides of the screen, by blocking each one with its respective paddle. Fail, and you lose!

This game is hard to play at first, but fun and addictive! Its unique four paddle design takes pong to an all new level!

How To Play

3D Spinball is controlled entirely by using the mouse. Click on, 'Start new game' from the title screen to begin.

After the Spinball moves down to the bottom, you may click the mouse to put the ball into motion. Your objective is to destroy all the blocks in the center by causing the Spinball to collide with them, while at the same time keeping the Spinball from touching the top, bottom, left, or right side of the screen.

You do this by guarding each side with its respective paddle. Move the mouse up or down, and the paddles on the left and right side move up or down, accordingly. Move the mouse left or right, and the paddles on the top and bottom move left or right. It seems simple, but its not!

FACING THE BOSS ENEMY

On the last level, (full version only) you must face a boss enemy. He is powerful. You must hit him with the Spinball many times to destroy him. He will shoot fake Spinballs at you, which you can identify by the red spot in their center. Do not allow your paddles to touch the fake Spinballs, as they will hurt you.

Identifying Blocks

There are multiple kinds of blocks in 3D Spinball you must destroy. Each have different properties.



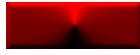
Red Circle- this block morphs once, and must be hit twice to be destroyed.



Green Circle- this block is destroyed after being hit only once.



Purple Circle- hit this block once, and it becomes an extra Spinball. Hit it again to set the extra Spinball into motion.



Red Block- the red block must be hit three times to be destroyed.



Blue Swirl Block- this block morphs and disintegrates slowly. It must be hit three times to be destroyed.



Rainbow Switch- this block is very special. When hit, it causes some invisible blocks to become visible so that you may hit them. It must be hit many, many, times to be destroyed.



Invisible Block- this type of block is sometimes visible, and sometimes invisible. You can use the Rainbow Switch to toggle it. It must be visible to be hit, and you must destroy all blocks to go to the next level. You must hit this block 7 times to destroy it.

OTHER ITEMS



The Spinball- this is the Spinball. Use it to destroy blocks while keeping it from touching a side.



The Paddle- this is one of the four paddles you use to hit the Spinball.
