Procedures for Quick Start Only

## Sign On At Mplayer

1 From the Start bar, choose Programs, then Mplayer, then Games and click a game title. Choose Online Chat if you don't know which game to play and you want to chat with other players.

2 Sign on with your user name and password. Mplayer verifies your user name and password and transports you to a lobby.

If you don't have an Mplayer account, you can sign up for one now. <u>Click here</u> for details.

### **Find Players**

From the game lobby, use one of these ways to find a player:

- <sup>n</sup> Doubleclick a game offer to enter a game room and chat with other players. Click Ready To Play? to let the moderator know you want to play the game.
- n Click Auto-Match. Mplayer places you in a game room, finds other players, and moderates the room.
- <sup>n</sup> Create a new game offer. You become the game offer moderator. Chat with players until someone agrees to play with you.

#### Launch Game

- n If you clicked a game offer or Auto-Match, wait for the moderator to launch the game.
- n If you are the game offer moderator, wait for enough players to accept the game offer. Click the flashing Launch Game button to launch the game.

*Note:* If you want to be part of the game launch and an OK or M doesn't appear next to your name on the roster, click the Ready To Play? button.

## Sign On At Mplayer

Before you can play games or chat with friends at Mplayer, you sign on at Mplayer.

- <sup>n</sup> First, Mplayer checks that you have the most current version of the software. If you don't, Mplayer automatically updates your software.
- n Then, Mplayer asks for your account information. Enter your user name and password. Press Enter or click OK.

#### User Name and Password

When you sign up for an Mplayer account, you are given a user name and password. Mplayer asks for this information when you access Mplayer member areas.

If you don't have an Mplayer account, you can sign up for one at http://www.mplayer.com/members/mplay-sign.html.

# Log Off Mplayer

You can exit Mplayer at any time by clicking in the right corner of the Mplayer window.

How To ... Play Games

#### Visit Game Arcades

Each Mplayer game has its own arcade. An arcade is filled with interesting tidbits and offers, including game software, contests, tournaments, and scores. Find out what you need to install, run, launch, and play the game at Mplayer.

There are lots of ways to get to a game arcade. For example:

- If you are in a lobby, game, or cafe room, click the Arcade button to view a list of games you can play. Doubleclick a title and Mplayer transports you to the game lobby.
- If you are wandering the World Wide Web, you can jump to the Mplayer game page at this address -http://www.mplayer.com/members/mplay-games.html. Click a game title to go to its arcade page.

#### Visit Game Lobbies

The game lobby is a place where you can view game offers, visit game rooms, and chat with other players who want to play the game.

There are lots of ways to get to a game lobby:

- n From a game arcade web page, click Browse Current Game Offers or Play Now.
- n From the Windows start menu, click Program Files, then Mplayer, then Games, then the name of the game you want to play.
- <sup>n</sup> From your desktop, find the MPI file for the game and click it.
- <sup>n</sup> From a game room, click arcade and doubleclick the game title.



Looking for someone to play with? Use Mplayer's Auto-Match feature and Mplayer will find players, moderate the game room, and launch the game for you.

Go to a game arcade page or a game lobby.
Click Play Now on the game's arcade page, or click the Auto-Match button in a game lobby. Mplayer assigns you to an auto-match room, if one exists. Otherwise, Mplayer creates a new auto-match room and transports you to it.
Wait for Mplayer to launch the game.

When the minimum number of players required to play the game are in the room, Mplayer begins a game launch countdown.

Mplayer launches the game when the countdown reaches zero. If, during the countdown, the preferred number of players for optimum gameplay join, Mplayer launches the game immediately.

#### Pick A Game Room To Visit

You've decided which game to play and you are in the game lobby. You're ready to enter a game room, chat with other players, and play a game. How do you choose the best one?

Game rooms have visual cues that help you choose. Pick a game room that is open (not locked, full, or playing) and are close enough to you for fast action and gameplay (near, not far). <u>Click here</u> to see various game room cues.

After you pick a game room, you can enter it.

#### **Enter Game Rooms**

1 Go to a game lobby.

2 Doubleclick a game offer name, or select a game offer name and press Enter.

The room status determines whether you can enter a room, and play the game offer. Click here for more information.

#### In A Game Room

Game rooms are associated with game offers. When you visit a game room, you join other players who want to play the same game offer.

You can

- <sup>n</sup> Chat with other players who are in the room with you.
- n Accept the game offer and wait for the game to launch.
- n Exit the game room.

You can also create your own game offer and moderate the game room. <u>Click here</u> for more information.

#### **View Game Settings**

To view or change game settings, click the Game Settings button to view the Game Settings Panel.

Some games have special settings that determine how the game starts out. For example, for Command & Conquer you can view the technical level, the number of units, the scenario, and other game-specific parts.

The moderator controls the game settings and can change them up until the time the game launches. If you are in a game room and want the moderator to change a setting, send a message before the game launches.

### **Check Games**

Mplayer checks to see if you have the game installed on your system and it's ready for you to play. To check a game,

- n If you are in a game room, click the Game Settings button and then click the Check Game button.
- n If you are in an auto-match room, click the <u>Check Game button</u>.

For more information about the requirements and installation for particular game, click the Back button twice to go to the game arcade page and check out the game's requirements and installation instructions. (not in B2)

If you do not have a particular game installed, you can still visit the game lobby and rooms. However, you can't play the game. (B2)

#### Accept Game Offers

To play a game, you must accept a game offer. To do this:

- 1 Go to a game lobby.
- 2 Doubleclick a game offer name. You are transported to a game room.

3 Click the Ready To Play? button to accept the offer. An OK appears next to your name on the roster.

You are scheduled to play with any players in the game room who have accepted the game offer. Wait for the moderator to launch the game. You can tell which player is the moderator by the big M next to the player's name on the roster.

If you decide not to play, click the Ready to Play! button. The OK is removed from your name on the roster.

For information about creating a game offer and becoming its moderator, <u>click here</u>.

#### Wait for Game Launch

After accepting a game offer, you wait for the moderator to launch the game.

Game launch can occur when the minimum <u>number of players</u> required have accepted a game offer. (The moderator sets the number of players when creating a game room.) At this point, the moderator can wait for additional players to accept the offer, or launch the game immediately.

#### Game Launch

If you haven't accepted the offer and the moderator launches the game, you'll see several player names disappear from the roster as they go off to play the game. You are left in the room with any other players who didn't accept the offer. At this point, you can

- <sup>n</sup> Continue chatting with the players.
- n Become the moderator and launch a new game.
- <sup>n</sup> Leave the game room.

## Stop Playing

When you stop playing a game, you end up in a game room with anyone who left the game at the same time as you did. You can

- <sup>n</sup> Chat with other players about what happened.
- Play again.
- $\ensuremath{\,{\ensuremath{\scriptscriptstyle n}}}\xspace$  Return to the game lobby and check out what rooms are available.
- n Log off Mplayer.

Exit procedures vary by game. The procedure for exiting a particular game is provided in its Mplayer help file.

#### Ways To Play A Game

Choose a game and go to the game's lobby. From the lobby you can:

- n Use Mplayer's matchmaker feature.
  - 1 Choose Auto-Match. Mplayer assigns you to an auto-match game room, or creates a new automatch game room.
  - 2 Wait for other players.
- Join as a regular player.
  - 1 Select a game offer and press Enter. Mplayer transports you to the game room.
  - 2 Click Ready To Play? to tell the moderator you want to play the game.
  - 3 Wait for the moderator to launch the game.
- n Create a game room and become its moderator.
  - 1 Click the Create Room button to create a new game offer.

2 Change the game settings, if they are available for the game you are going to play. Click the Game Settings button, then click the Modify Settings button.

- 3 Moderate the game room.
- 4 Wait for enough players to accept the game offer.
- 5 Launch the game.
- n Join a player who paged and invited you into a game room.
  - 1 Answer Page.
  - 2 Click Join to join the player.

*Note:* Each game has its own start up procedures, options, and exit procedures. This information is provided in the game's help area. For more information, click Help to go to the Help Desk and click Help For A Game.

## Ways To Enter A Game Lobby

- <sup>n</sup> From the game's arcade page at Mplayer.
- <sup>n</sup> From the Windows 95 Start Menu.
- <sup>n</sup> Click the Arcade button in another game lobby or at the Mplayer Café and doubleclick a game.
- n Join a player who paged and invited you into a game lobby.
- n Click a game's MPI file.

#### Notes About Game Offers & Rooms

- <sup>n</sup> You can only be in one game or cafe room at a time.
- You can visit a game room and chat with other players without accepting the game offer When the moderator launches the game, you and any other players who haven't accepted the game offer remain in the game room. The first player to click the Ready To Play? button becomes the moderator.
- If the moderator leaves the game offer, the moderator loses moderator status. Another player who has accepted the game offer, becomes moderator. If player in the room has accepted the game offer, the first one to click the Ready To Play button becomes the moderator.
- n If you are in a game room by yourself and you leave the game room, the room is removed.

## How To ... Moderate Game Offers

### Become a Moderator

Here are some ways you can become a game room moderator:

- <sup>n</sup> Create a game offer Mplayer creates a game room and you automatically become its moderator.
- n Click Ready To Play? in a game room that has no moderator (for example, after a game offer has launched).
- n Inherit moderator status when the moderator decides not to moderate in a game room where you have already accepted the game offer.

#### **Create Game Offers**

- 1 Go to a game lobby and click the Create Room button. Mplayer displays the Game Offer dialog.
- 2 Enter the Offer Name.
- 3 (optional) Enter Moderator Comment.
- 4 (optional) Change the <u>Number of Players</u>.
- 5 (optional) Change the Age of Players.
- 6 Click OK.

Mplayer creates the game offer and transports you to your own game room. You are the moderator for the game offer. Your name appears on the roster with an M next to it.

#### Offer Name

Enter up to 40 letters, symbols, and numbers for the game offer name. Other players in the game lobby see your game offer name.

#### **Moderator Comment**

Enter enticing descriptions and comments designed to lure players into your game room.

#### Number of Players

Change to increase the minimum number of players, or decrease the maximum number of players. For example, if you want to play Terminal Velocity with three or more players, you would change the minimum number of players from two to three.

Minimum Least number of players who must accept your game offer before you can launch the game

Maximum The most players the game allows, or the preferred number of players you want to accept your game offer before you launch the game.

## Age of Players

Change to restrict the age of the players allowed in your game offer. For example, you can allow only players between the ages of 18 and 25 to play your game offer.

The default is usually set to allow all players into a game offer, unless the game is an adult game, or is restricted in some other way.

### Moderate Game Rooms

When you moderate a game room, you assume certain responsibilities for the game offer. As moderator, you

- n Launch the game.
- <sup>n</sup> Control game room options.
- n Control game settings.
- <sup>n</sup> Can change a player's gameplay status.

There are several ways to become a moderator.

#### **Change Game Settings**

The moderator controls the settings for game startup. Other players can view the information.

1 Click the Game Settings Panel button

2 Change any settings you wish. For more information about a particular game's game settings, click the Help button and select Help For A Game.

For example, for Command & Conquer you can view the technical level, the number of units, the scenario, and other game-specific options.

Note: Some games have special settings for game start up. Some don't.

## Change Player's Game Status

- 1 Right-click a player's name on the roster
- 2 Choose De-Select User.
- The player's game status changes from Set To Play To Play to Ready To Play?.

Lock Game Room Click the Lock icon to keep players from entering your game or café room. Unlock Game Room Click the Lock icon to allow players to enter a previously locked game or café room.

#### Launch Games

When enough players accept the game offer, the moderator sees the Launch Game button flash. The moderator can wait for more players to accept the game offer, or click the Launch Game button to launch the game.

All players with game buttons showing Ready To Play! are transported to the game. Players who didn't push down the Ready To Play? button remain in the game room. The next player to push the Ready To Play? button becomes the game room moderator. *Note:* Only a moderator or Mplayer (in an auto-match room) can launch a game.

# Stop Being A Moderator

If you are a game room moderator and you no longer want to moderate, you can

- <sup>n</sup> Click the Ready To Play! button.
- n Exit the game room.

How To ... Chat, Scribble etc. Procedures

### **Communicate With Other Players**

There are many ways to communicate with other players. In a game or café room, you can

- n Send and view messages. <u>Click here</u> for more information.
- n Scribble and draw on the Scribbleboard. You must be in a game or café room to scribble. <u>Click here</u> for more information.
- <sup>n</sup> Talk using your microphone. You must be in a game or café room to talk to other players with your microphone. Click here for more information.

#### View & Send Messages

### **View Messages**

Messages from other players and messages you send are displayed in the chat viewport (part of the chat panel).

#### Send Messages

- 1 Point at the chat box and click.
- 2 Type your message.

3 Press Enter when you are ready to send your message to the other players.

Right click to view a menu that you can use to change fonts, text color, and other options.

#### To Everyone

Type your message in the text box and press Enter. Mplayer sends the message to all players in the room.

#### To One Player

Select the player name on the roster, type the message, and press Enter. Mplayer sends the message to the selected player. You can also type the player name, a colon, and then your message. For example, AcePilot:Meet me in HotTV1.

#### **To Several Players**

Hold down the Ctrl key and select the players you want to send your message to. Type your message and press Enter. You can also type a player name, then a comma, then another player name. To end the list, type colon, then type your message, and press Enter. For example, samf, julietg:here's our team strategy.

Note: Beta 2 does not include all selective chatting features. (B2)

### Chat Panel

Chat Box Area in which you can edit messages, cut and copy text, and change the font type, size, and color by right clicking the chat box. Send messages to everyone in the room or selected players.

Chat Viewport Displays messages between players.

Splitter Bar Appears in between the chat box and chat viewport. Use to expand chat areas.

You can access the chat panel from the lobby or within a game or café room.

# Change Chat Fonts

To change chat fonts, point at the chat input box and right click. Use the menu options to change fonts, size, and color:

Option	Action
Bold	Toggle boldface.
Italic	Toggle italics.
Underline	Toggle underline.
Point Size	Change the font size.
Font	Select a new font, or change a font's attributes including color, size, and emphasis.
Font History	Last four fonts selected.

### Edit Chat Text

Use the standard Windows editing keys to edit chat text. You can also position cursor over the chat box and right-click to display a menu with these options:

Option	Action
Cut	Remove the selected text and put it on the clipboard.
Сору	Copy the selected text to the clipboard.
Paste	Insert the text on the clipboard at the cursor location.
Delete	Remove the selected text and don't put it on the clipboard.
Insert Return	Insert carriage return without sending message.
Send Message	Same as pressing Enter to send a message.

### The Scribbleboard

- 1 Go to a game room or café room.
- 2 Click the <u>Scribble Panel</u> button.

3 Draw on the board. Use the Scribble toolset buttons to change the drawing tool, line size, or color. Anything you scribble on the Scribbleboard is viewed by all players in the game or café room.

# Change Drawing Tool

- 1. Click the Scribble Panel button to display the Scribbleboard and tools.
- 2 Click the Drawing Tool button.
- 3 Click a drawing tool on the drawing toolset box.

### **Pick A Color**

- 1 Click the Color button. The color palette appears.
- 2 Click a color.
- 3 Click OK.

#### **Create A Custom Color**

While displaying color palette.

- 1 Doubleclick a color.
- 2 Point at the color you want on the display, or enter values.
- 3 Click Add To Custom Colors, if you want the color to be shown in the custom palette (below regular colors).
- 4 Click OK.

# Change Line Size



- 1 Click Line Size button. The size box appears.
- 2 Click the size you want to draw with.



# Talking

Use your microphone to talk to other players while you are in a game or cafe room. Speak into your microphone while holding down the Talk button.

When someone is speaking into a microphone, their profile appears above the talk button. You cannot press down the talk button while this player is speaking. One player talks at a time.

# Page Players

You can contact any player who is logged on at Mplayer and is not playing a game:

- 1 Click the Find button.
- 2 Enter the player's user name.
- 3 Type a message in the Message box.
- 4 If you want to invite the other player to join you, click Send Invitation.
- 5 Click Send.

# **Receive Pages**

If you want to receive pages from other players at Mplayer, do the following:

- 1 Click Options.
- 2 Click the Notifications tab.
- 3 Click the Accept User Pages box. An X in the box means you will receive pages unless you are playing a game.

# Respond to a Page

When another player at Mplayer pages you, you can respond by typing a message and clicking the Reply button.

# Join Paged Player

A player can invite you to join them in a game or café lobby or room. To join them, click Join. (For Beta 2, you can join a player in a lobby, not in a game room).

- 1 Select a player in the roster.
- 2 Right-click the player's name.
- 3 Choose View User Profile.

The player's profile appears.

# **Change Portraits**

- 1 Click the Help button and click Select Portrait.
- 2 Browse the portrait gallery until you find a personae you like.
- 3 Click to select it.
- 4 Click the Select button to change.

- 1 Right-click game offer name.
- 2 Choose one of the menu options.
- n View by Large Icon
- n View by Small Icon
- n View by List
- n View Details



From within a game or café room, click the Scribble Panel button to display the Scribbleboard and access the Scribble toolset.

#### **Create A New Account**

(UNDER CONSTRUCTION: For B2, this topic documents all the steps in the Create Account script.)

1 From the Windows Start Bar, choose Programs, then Mplayer, and click Create A New Account. Mplayer connects to the Internet and welcomes you. Then Mplayer guides you through the sign-up process. At any point, You can

- n Click Next to go to the next screen.
- n Click Back if you want to return to the previous screen.
- n Click Cancel If you don't want to create a new account at this time, click Cancel.
- 2 Read the instructions and click Next to continue.
- 3 Enter contact information and click Next to continue.
- 4 Read the user name instructions and click Next to continue.
- 5 Enter a user name. If the user name is already taken, you are asked to choose a different user name. Click Next to continue.
- 6. Enter a password for your account.
- n Enter your password.
- n Enter your password again to confirm what you typed.
- n Click the Remember Password box, if you don't want to type your password every time you sign on at Mplayer.
- n Click Next to continue.
- 7 Read the billing setup instructions and click Next.
- 8 Choose a billing plan. Enter your secret promotional code, if you have one. Click Next to continue.
- 9 Enter billing information:
- n Choose a <u>billing type</u>.
- n Enter your credit card number and expiration date.
- n Change any information that is different from your contact information.
- n Click Next to continue.

10 Read the license agreement. Click Accept to agree to the terms and conditions. Mplayer creates your account and starts the sign on process. If you choose Decline, your account will not be created.

- 11 Read the instructions and click Next to continue.
- 12 Enter your user name and password. Click Log On.
- 13 Create your profile:
- n Browse the portrait gallery until you find a portrait you like. Click it and then click Select.
- n Enter a description you want others to see.

#### **Contact Information**

Name Email address Phone numbers Mailing address Your full name and form of address you prefer. Location where you receive electronic mail. Daytime, evening, and fax phone numbers. Location where you receive regular (snail) mail.

#### User Name

When you sign up for an Mplayer account, you choose a user name. The name you choose must be three to 16 characters long. It can include letters, numbers, hyphens, periods, and spaces. It must begin and end with a letter or number. You can only have one hyphen, period, or space in sequence. For example:

Allowed	Not Allowed
dragon-5	dragon-5-
Amazon	&(\$Amazon
X.Warrior	X_Warrior
Rock 1234	Rock 1234

When you sign on at Mplayer, Mplayer requests your user name and password. Other players can use your user name to page you and send messages. Your user name shows up on the roster when you are in an Mplayer lobby, game room, or chat room.

#### Password

A password is a series of five to 16 characters you use to sign on at Mplayer and access your account. A password prevents unauthorized people from using your account.

When you choose a password, avoid using common words or names. A combination of characters (upper and lowercase), numbers, and symbols makes your password difficult for other people to guess.

Do not give anyone your password, including people who appear to be representing Mplayer, Mpath, or game companies.

### Profile

A profile is a combination of a description you enter and a picture that you choose from the Mplayer <u>portrait gallery</u>. Your profile can be viewed by other players.

# Change Contact Information

- 1 Click the Help button. Click Modify Account.
- 2 Select the Contact tab.
- 3 Change your <u>contact information</u> as needed.

## Add Subaccounts

You can add one or more users (subaccounts) to your Mplayer account. Here's one way:

- 1 Click Help to display the Help Desk. Click Modify Account.
- 2 Select the User tab.
- 3 Click the New User button.

# Change User Information

- 1 Click Help to display the Help Desk. Click Modify Account.
- 2 Select the User tab.
- 3 Select the user.

### **User Information**

User Name	Name of the user you want to display or change information for
Name	Your full name and form of address you prefer.
Email address	Address where you receive electronic mail.
Birthday	User's date of birth. Used to determine game age limits and restrictions.
Usage Limits	Set if you want to be advised when user account reaches a certain number of hours; restrict the user account to a maximum number of hours per day.
Creation Date	Date the user account was created.
Expiration Date	Date the user account expires.
Game Content Limits	Set age limits based on game content ratings for language, sexual content, and violence.

### Change Password

- 1 Click Help to display the Help Desk. Click Modify Account.
- 2 Select the Password tab.
- 3 Select the user.
- 4 Enter a new password in the Password box.
- 5 Enter the new password again in the Confirm Password box.

6 Enter the current password for the account you are changing in the Current Password box. You cannot change a password

without knowing what it is in the first place. This is to prevent unauthorized people from accessing and changing your password. *Note*: Don't forget your password. Don't tell anyone your password. If you are creating a password for a subaccount, only give tell them not to give out their password.

Café room	A place where you can chat with other players without choosing a particular game.
Color palette	A collection of colors you can select from and draw with on the Scribbleboard.
Game lobby	A place where you can view all the game offers for a particular game.
Game offer	How players are joined together so they can play the same instance of a game.
Game offer name	The name given to a game offer when it is created. Game rooms are identified by their game offer name.
Game room	A place where you can chat with other players who want to play the same game and become part of a game launch.
Game launch	something that occurs after enough players in a game room decide to a play a game. The game launches and exciting multiplayer action begins.
Games	See Mplayer games.
Game settings	Some games have special settings that determine how the game starts out. The game room moderator controls the settings. Other players can view them and request changes by sending a message to the moderator.
Mplayer account	A user name and password that allows you to sign on at Mplayer.
Mplayer arcade	A place at Mplayer where you can learn about a game and its creators and enter the game lobby.
Mplayer Café	A fun place to meet and chat with other players.
Mplayer games	Games you can play at Mplayer. For some games, you need the Mplayer version. For others, you need the Mplayer extensions to play the game at Mplayer.
Multiplayer	Many players playing a game simultaneously.
Paging	A way to call players who are not engaged in gameplay throughout Mplayer.
Password	A series of 5 to 16 characters that allows you to access your Mplayer account. Your password is like the combination to a vault. Don't give it to others.
Portrait	A graphic representation that appears along with your user name.
Roster	The list of players in a game or café room.
Scribbleboard	A shared whiteboard where you can scribble messages and drawings. Whatever you scribble is seen by all other players in the game or café room.
ScribbleTalk	Specially designed Mplayer software that lets you chat, scribble and talk to other players in lobbies, game rooms, and cafes.
Scribbling	Creating art on the Scribbleboard with the graphics toolset.
Talking	Realtime speech using a microphone.
Text chat	A way to talk to other players using your keyboard. Type text into the chat box in a lobby, game room, or at the cafe.
User name	A unique name that identifies you and your account at Mplayer.


