

# "Brittania"

This is a simple PUD, none of the weird stuff in some of my others. It starts out as a rescue mission, with 6 warriors and a transport. Follow the arrow, rescue the peasants and their town prepare to kick Orcish butt. It's that simple, but not that easy. The "odd" thing about this PUD is what I attempted to do with the map. If you uncover the entire map, you'll probably see why I call it "Brittania." The difficulty level in all of my PUDs is pretty high, my wife (who does her best to objectively test my PUDs), says they are too difficult, but I assumed that anyone who had completed Warcraft 2 was ready for more challenge. So, if you think it is just too much, feel free to change it in any way you see fit. I have beat all of my PUD's without cheating however, so I know it's not impossible. If you do decide to alter them, don't be surprized if they don't work anymore. Sometimes the artificial intelligence needs "nursing" to work properly. The best way to "tone them down", is to reduce the amount of gold in the enemy gold mines. If you don't already know, the method for doing this is as follows. 1) Go in to the Warcraft 2 Map Editor. 2) Click on file. 3) Click on open. 4) Click on the letter of your CD-ROM drive(you PC-Gamer disk should be in this drive.) 5) Click on the War 2 file. 6) Click on the Brittania PUD (not the read file of the same title which you are now reading,) and click open. 7) Once in the PUD, find the enemy gold mines and click on them with the right mouse button. 8) A menu should appear which allows you to customize the amount of gold in the mines. I'm not trying to insult anyone's intellience, I just don't think it's fair to assume that everyone knows how to do this. I've only had my computer for about 4 months, and would have appreciated it if some of these software companies had not assumed I already knew what they were talking about. If you like what I did with the map, and would like to use it to do something else with it, go for it, I have no objections, and would feel flattered.
