Overview

Screen Loupe displays a magnified view of whatever is beneath the mouse cursor, much like a printer's or jeweler's loupe. As you move the mouse about the desktop the Screen Loupe window will display the region currently underneath the mouse at the currently selected viewing magnification.



Window Size

Screen Loupe's main window can be resized. This feature makes it ideal for screen captures. Just size the window to accommodate the area you wish to copy and press Ctrl+C.

Tools

Screen Loupe also displays information about the current hardware configuration and dynamic system resource usage as well as an ASCII / ANSI character code chart, MS Windows Error Codes and resizable Horizontal and Vertical rulers.

Sight Impairments

Screen Loupe was originally designed to facilitate accurate viewing of graphic images during program development, but many people have written to me regarding its use as a screen magnifier for computer users with vision impairments. If you are using Screen Loupe as a screen magnifier for this purpose see the section regarding [Viewing a Fixed Region](#).

Desktop Locations

Screen Loupe's location on the desktop is saved when the program is exited. Whenever you start Screen Loupe it will reappear on the desktop where you last placed it. Screen Loupe dialog box locations are also stored and reused the next time they are opened.

Taskbar Tray

Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT can be optionally configured to place its program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. This option provides a simple means of keeping the taskbar button region clear for other running programs.

Installing Screen Loupe

Installation

To install Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT on your computer simply create a new, empty folder and place the files; LOUPE.EXE, LOUPE.CNT and LOUPE.HLP there.

LOUPE.EXE	- The Screen Loupe Application
LOUPE.HLP	- The Windows 95/NT Help File
LOUPE.CNT	- The Windows 95/NT Help Contents File

To integrate Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT with the MS Windows Explorer select the Screen Loupe Explorer Setup dialog box while Screen Loupe is running.

Note If you have an earlier version of Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT installed on your computer, simply replace the LOUPE.EXE, LOUPE.CNT and LOUPE.HLP files with the newer versions.

Note The LOUPE.INI file is no longer used and can be deleted. The various application settings specified in the Screen Loupe Options dialog box as well as the main window's size and location on the desktop are now stored in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry.

Note Some earlier versions of Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT included a LOUPE.WRI documentation file. This file has been replaced by the LOUPE.HLP file and can now be deleted.

Warning If you rename the LOUPE.EXE file you must also rename the HLP file using the same basename. For example if you change the Screen Loupe application file name to NewName.exe, rename the help file to NewName.hlp. The HLP file *must* reside in the same folder as the Screen Loupe application file itself.

Configuring Screen Loupe

Screen Loupe Options

Select the **File | Options** menu item to display the Screen Loupe Options dialog box. This window will allow you to change the various Screen Loupe program settings listed below.

Screen Loupe Window Refresh Rate

Selects a viewing window refresh rate. For most applications the **Normal** refresh rate will be adequate. If you have a fast computer system you may want to select the **Fast** setting. Use the **Slow** setting for older systems or when you only need to use Screen Loupe for screen capture operations.

Launch Multiple Instances

Check this item to allow more than one instance of Screen Loupe to be run on the desktop.

Place Icon in Taskbar Tray

Check this item to display a small Screen Loupe program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. If this item is selected and the Screen Loupe window is minimized a button will not be added to the Taskbar, to restore the Screen Loupe window on the desktop press the small icon in the taskbar tray instead. This option is available to keep the taskbar free for other running programs.

Show HTML Color Triplets

Check this item to display the color value directly beneath the mouse cursor as an HTML color triplet. If this item is not checked the color of the pixel beneath the mouse cursor will be displayed as a normal RGB hexadecimal value.

Play Shutter Sound when Copying

Check this box to play a SLR camera shutter sound when the Screen Loupe display window is copied to the Clipboard.

Beep when Locking the View

Check this box to issue a warning beep when view locking is turned on and off.

Keep these Windows Topmost on the Desktop

Check these boxes to make the specified child windows topmost on the Desktop. Keeping the **Horizontal** and **Vertical** rulers topmost will make measurement of desktop objects easier. Making the **System Information** window topmost will provide a simple means of monitoring application launches.

OK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of Screen Loupe program options. When you press this button the Screen Loupe Options dialog box will be closed and your settings will be saved.

Cancel

Press this button to close the Screen Loupe Options dialog box without making any changes. If you have made any changes to the option settings, and then press this button your changes will not be used, and your previous settings will remain in use.

Help

Press this button to open the Screen Loupe Help Window and go directly to the Configuring Screen Loupe topic.

Note The options you have selected will be saved when you press the **OK** button. The desktop location of the Screen Loupe Options window itself will also be stored. Your settings will be saved in the MS Windows 95/NT [System Registry](#).

Screen Loupe Explorer Setup

Screen Loupe Explorer Setup

Select the **Help | Setup** menu item to display the Screen Loupe Setup dialog box. This window will allow you to integrate Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT with the Microsoft Windows 95/NT Explorer. Use this command to create and remove MS Explorer shortcuts.

Create a Start Menu Item

Check this item to create a Screen Loupe Start Menu entry. The Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT program will be located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Screen Loupe item already exists in the Software by Design folder.

Remove this Start Menu Item

Check this item to remove the Screen Loupe entry located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Screen Loupe item does not already exist in the Software by Design folder.

Create a Desktop Icon

Check this item to create a Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT program icon on the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Screen Loupe desktop icon already exists.

Remove Icon from the Desktop

Check this item to remove the Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT program icon from the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Screen Loupe desktop icon does not already exist.

Create a Startup Folder Item

Check this item to automatically run Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT whenever Microsoft Windows is started. This option creates a Screen Loupe program icon in the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Screen Loupe startup item already exists in the Startup folder.

Remove the Startup Folder Item

Check this item to remove Screen Loupe from the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Screen Loupe startup item does not already exist in the Startup folder.

OK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of MS Explorer shortcuts. When you press this button the Screen Loupe Setup dialog box will be closed and the MS Explorer shortcuts you have selected will be created or removed.

Cancel

Press this button to close the Screen Loupe Explorer Setup dialog box without creating or removing any MS Explorer shortcuts.

Help

Press this button to open the Screen Loupe Help window and go directly to the Screen Loupe Explorer Setup topic.

File Menu

File Menu Commands

The File menu provides commands to configure and exit Screen Loupe. A short description of each item follows:

Options

Opens the [Screen Loupe Options](#) dialog box and allows you to change Screen Loupe program settings. Use this command to configure the Screen Loupe program.

Exit

Closes the Screen Loupe program and returns control to the Explorer desktop. The **Ctrl+Q** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used File commands can be invoked using [shortcut keys](#).

Edit Menu

Edit Menu Commands

The Edit menu provides commands used to copy the contents of the Screen Loupe window to the Clipboard.

Copy

Copy the current Screen Loupe window's view to the Clipboard. The **Ctrl+C** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used Edit commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

View Menu

View Menu Commands

The View menu provides commands used to change Screen Loupe display options. These items provide a means of changing the Screen Loupe window appearance. A short description of each item follows:

Position

Use this command to turn the mouse position region on and off. If this item is checked Screen Loupe will display the current mouse location in global screen coordinates as well as report the color of the pixel directly beneath the mouse pointer. With this item checked you will also be able to quickly change the view magnification using the radio buttons displayed at the bottom of the view region.

Crosshair

Use this command to turn the viewing crosshair on and off. If this item is checked Screen Loupe will display a small crosshair target at the center of the viewing window. Use this command to accurately locate the center of a displayed image.

Normal Size

Use this command to set Screen Loupe's magnification to the normal 1:1 rate. The **Ctrl+1** shortcut can be used for this command.

2x Zoom

Use this command to set Screen Loupe's magnification to the 2:1 rate. The **Ctrl+2** shortcut can be used for this command. Images will appear twice as large as they really are when this magnification rate is selected.

4x Zoom

Use this command to set Screen Loupe's magnification to the 4:1 rate. The **Ctrl+4** shortcut can be used for this command. Images will appear four times as large as they really are when this magnification rate is selected.

8x Zoom

Use this command to set Screen Loupe's magnification to the 8:1 rate. The **Ctrl+8** shortcut can be used for this command. Images will appear eight times as large as they really are when this magnification rate is selected.

Lock View

Use this command to lock the current view. The **Ctrl+K** shortcut can be used for this command.

Fixed View

Use this command to view a fixed region of the desktop. The **Ctrl+F** shortcut can be used for this command.

Minimize

Minimizes the Screen Loupe window to a button or icon on the taskbar. The **Ctrl+Y** shortcut can be used for this command.

Always on Top

Use this command to keep the Screen Loupe window top most on the desktop. When this item is checked the Screen Loupe window will float above all other non-topmost windows on the desktop. This item is useful if you normally run Screen Loupe with a small window that would be easily obscured by other applications. The **Ctrl+T** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used View commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

Tools Menu

Tools Menu Commands

The Tools menu provides commands used to open and display Screen Loupe tool windows. A short description of each item follows:

Horizontal Ruler

Opens the Horizontal Ruler window. The **Ctrl+R** shortcut can be used for this command.

Vertical Ruler

Opens the Vertical Ruler window. The **Ctrl+L** shortcut can be used for this command.

ASCII Chart

Opens the ASCII Chart window. The **Ctrl+A** shortcut can be used for this command.

Error Codes

Opens the Error Codes window. The **Ctrl+E** shortcut can be used for this command.

System Information

Opens the System Information window. The **Ctrl+S** shortcut can be used for this command.

Help

Opens the Screen Loupe Help window and displays the Table of Contents. The **F1** shortcut can be used for this command.

Setup

Displays the Screen Loupe Setup dialog box. This window provides options to integrate Screen Loupe with the MS Windows Explorer. Use this window to create MS Explorer Start Menu items and desktop icons.

About Loupe

Displays the Screen Loupe splash box. This window contains program information, the current version of Screen Loupe you are running and a program copyright notice. Click the mouse anywhere in this window to close it

Tip Commonly used Help commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

Shortcut Keys

Shortcuts

Shortcut keys allow you to quickly invoke Screen Loupe menu commands without first displaying the menu and then selecting an item from it. The most commonly used Screen Loupe commands can be invoked using the following shortcut keys.

File Menu

Ctrl+Q Exit Screen Loupe, and return to the desktop

Edit Menu

Ctrl+C Copy the current view

View Menu

Ctrl+1 Set magnification rate to 1:1

Ctrl+2 Set magnification rate to 2:1

Ctrl+4 Set magnification rate to 4:1

Ctrl+8 Set magnification rate to 8:1

Ctrl+K Toggle locked viewing

Ctrl+F Toggle fixed viewing

Ctrl+Y Minimize Screen Loupe to a button or icon

Ctrl+T Make the Screen Loupe window topmost

Tools Menu

Ctrl+R Open the Horizontal Ruler window

Ctrl+L Open the Vertical Ruler window

Ctrl+A Open the ASCII Chart window

Ctrl+E Open the Error Codes window

Ctrl+S Open the System Information window

Copying the Current View

Copying the Current View

You can copy the current contents of the Loupe window to the clipboard using **Ctrl+C**, (using the Copy item on the Edit menu will simply copy the menu itself).

To copy a portion of the screen; make Loupe the active window, place the mouse over the area to be copied and press **Ctrl+C** to copy the Loupe display at the current magnification rate to the clipboard.

Once an image has been placed on the Clipboard it can be easily transfer into another application that allows graphics imaged to be pasted into documents.

Locking the Current View

Locking the Current View

You can lock the image currently displayed in the Loupe window using **Ctrl+K**.

This command, like the copy command needs to be carried out from the keyboard, or you will wind up with a locked view of the menu itself.

Press **Ctrl+K** again to turn off view locking and return to normal viewing.

Viewing a Fixed Region

Viewing a Fixed Region

Screen Loupe can be used to view a fixed region of the display instead of tracking the mouse as it moves.

To use the Fixed View option make Screen Loupe the active window, move the mouse to the location on the display to be used as the viewing area and press **Ctrl+F**.

To restore Screen Loupe to normal mouse tracking press **Ctrl+F** again.

Note After resizing the Screen Loupe viewing window you will need to turn Fixed Viewing on again.

Horizontal Ruler

Horizontal Ruler

Select the **Tools | Horizontal Ruler** menu item to open and display a small horizontal pixel ruler. You can also use the **Ctrl+R** shortcut to display this window.

The length of this window can be adjusted to accommodate your current screen size. Use this window to make accurate measurements of items on the desktop.

Tip Increase Screen Loupe's viewing magnification to make it easier to read the horizontal ruler graticule.

Vertical Ruler

Vertical Ruler

Select the **Tools | Vertical Ruler** menu item to open and display a small vertical pixel ruler. You can also use the **Ctrl+L** shortcut to display this window.

The height of this window can be adjusted to accommodate your current screen size. Use this window to make accurate measurements of items on the desktop.

Tip Increase Screen Loupe's viewing magnification to make it easier to read the vertical ruler graticule.

ASCII Chart

ASCII Chart

Select the **Tools | ASCII Chart** menu item to open and display a window containing the ASCII / ANSI character set. You can also use the **Ctrl+A** shortcut to display this window.

Displaying Character Codes

Click the left mouse button on a character in this chart to display its ASCII code in decimal, octal and hexadecimal.

Copying Special Characters

Click the right mouse button on a character in this chart to copy the selected character to the Clipboard. This command is useful if you want to copy characters that do not appear on a normal keyboard. From the Clipboard these characters can easily be copied into other text editing programs.

Error Codes

MS Windows 95/NT Error Codes

Select the **Tools | Error Codes** menu item to display a list of all Microsoft Windows 95/NT errors codes and their descriptions. You can also use the **Ctrl+E** shortcut to display this window.

When this item is selected Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT will query the operating system and build a list of all error codes defined for the operating system. This list will contain the actual error code numbers as well as a short description of what each error code means. This list may be useful if you have other programs that produce error code warnings, but do not include an explanation of what the actual error means.

Error codes will be displayed in a list that contains both the decimal error code number as well as the hexadecimal value of the error.

System Information

System Information

To activate the System Information window select the **Tools | Information** menu choice or press the **Ctrl+S** shortcut key. A small window will be opened and displayed on the desktop showing the current system configuration and resource usage.

This window is dynamically updated as system resources change. The following items are reported:

Microsoft Windows

This region displays the version of MS Windows installed on your computer and the type of CPU found. If you are using a system that has more than one processor installed this will also be reported here.

Memory

This region displays the total amount of RAM available to Windows as well as the amount of memory that is currently free. MS Windows 95 cannot use the lower 640K of memory used by MS DOS so the total RAM available will be slightly less than the total RAM installed on your system. The free memory value will change dynamically as programs are loaded, run and unloaded.

Note MS Windows 95/NT systems use virtual memory, so as physical memory is exhausted virtual memory is created. Watch the Swap gauge in the Resources section to monitor virtual memory allocation.

Video Monitor

This region displays the current video display resolution and the number of colors available as follows:

- 1-bit:** black & white (monochrome)
- 4-bit:** 16 colors or shades of gray
- 8-bit:** 256 colors or shades of gray
- 16-bit:** Thousands of colors
- 32-bit:** Millions of colors

Resources

This region displays three gauges showing the current resource usage for the System, RAM and Swap space. These items will change as programs are loaded, used and unloaded. The color of the gauge changes based upon the current usage as follows:

- Blue:** less than 90% usage
- Yellow:** less than 95% used
- Red:** more than 95% used

Note If you are having trouble loading a program check these values as you attempt to launch the application.

Command Line Arguments

Command Line Arguments

Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT can be invoked using command line parameters. If command line parameters are detected at launch time Screen Loupe will use those settings detected.

System Registry

Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT System Registry Key

Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry. These settings are updated automatically while Screen Loupe is running. There is no need to edit these settings manually.

If you insist upon editing these settings, you do so at your own risk. Screen Loupe automatically updates registry entries when it exits. If you edit these settings make sure Screen Loupe is not running while you edit them. If Screen Loupe is currently running your changes will be overwritten when Screen Loupe exits.

Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the following system registry key:

If you find that Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT does not meet your needs you can remove it from your computer system by simply deleting the following files from your hard drive. All of these files will be located in the folder that you originally installed Screen Loupe in.

Loupe.exe	Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT application program.
Loupe.cnt	Screen Loupe Help Topics File
Loupe.hlp	Screen Loupe Help File

If you have opened and used the Screen Loupe for Windows 95/NT Help files your system may contain the following two (2) files. These files are created by the standard MS Windows 95/NT Help program WinHlp32.exe. These files may also be safely removed.

Loupe.gid	MS Windows Help settings file. This file contains the Screen Loupe Help window size and desktop location as well as any bookmarks you may have created.

Note If you have installed Screen Loupe shortcuts on the MS Explorer Start Menu use the **Help | Setup** command to remove the shortcuts you created before you delete the Screen Loupe files mentioned above.
