 ${\sim}A$ graphic board is recommended but not required because of the five different colour depth (24 to 4 Bit).


BTW: The difference between the 24 and 8 Bit version is hardly to be seen.

- ~Now rename for example if you want to use it with IBrowse the anim to ~def_TransferAnimation and the corresponding icon to def_TransferAnimation.info and copy both files into the IBrowse/Images directory (... don't forget to backup the original transfer animation ... although there's no need anymore ;-)).
