I do a hell of a lot of web sites (I'm part of a Web Publishing company) and I found it very annoying having to load up something ViewTek or Visage, going to the images directory, and then loading them so I could simply have a look at what the width and height of the pic was, so I could add the WIDTH and HEIGHT tags to the <IMG> tag on the web sites.

After getting very frustrated, a guy named Chris Turpin suggested that I made a program that would give you information like that. So I did! And here's DTInfo.

## 1.4 System Requirements

These are the System Requirements for DTInfo:

- Workbench 3.0 (or higher)
- The correct Datatypes for the pictures\*

\* = You can find almost ANY datatype on Aminet.

## 1.5 Installation

Simply copy the drawer to wherever you want DTInfo to be!

## 1.6 Usage

Using Data Type Info is easy!

Simply run the program, and drop a picture file onto it. A requester will then come up with some statistics about the picture, which are:

Data Type = (eg ILBM, GIF, JPEG/JFIF)

Width = (eg 320, 640, 1280)

Height = (eg 256, 512, 1024)

Depth = (eg 2, 4, 8)

Simply click on "OK" and then you can drag some other files onto it!

The latest version (1.12) now supports CLI output. This means you can go to the shell, and simply type something like "DT-Info PPaint:Pictures/AmigaDOS-8.iff" and it output to the CLI. This can be useful for BBS systems.

## 1.7 Bugs!

- If a picture is 15-bit, 16-bit or 24-bit, DTInfo will still say that it's 256 colours. I don't think it's a bug, it's the way Blitz2 handles Data Types, so it can't be sorted :(

22/08/97 - Now has CLI output, so it's useful for BBS systems. (Suggested by Damien McKenna) (1.12)
