1.2 What is PhotoAlbum?

PhotoAlbum is the sensational new picture management software for all Amigas and Dracos with at least OS3.0. It features

- * extremely fast loading functions for more than 20 picture file formats
 - * asynchronous loading incl. automatic preloading of not yet visible pages (load e.g. full pictures while thumbnails are still loaded); intelligent cache memory management (max. cache can be preconfigured)
 - * easy and intuitive usage (get a fast overview over a directory or even full CD of pictures by simple selection of the directory...)
 - * combinable picture subtitles (name, comment, size, type, ...); subtitle font is configurable by Tooltypes
 - * high functionality (unlimited number of image windows with scrolling and zooming functions can be opened)
 - * Presentation of thumbnails and full pictures in reduced colors on all Amigas and in HighColor/TrueColor with CyberGraphX compatible systems (incl. Draco) or systems compatible to CyberGraphX (e.g. on "Picasso 96" systems)
 - * Delete function to sort out unwanted pictures (full version only)
-

- * Copy function to copy groups of files to another directory (full version only)
- * ARexx loading commands can be send to ADPro, ArtEffect, PPaint, XiPaint 4, ImageFX and Photogenics (full version only)
- * External viewers "CyberShow" and "CyberTVPlayer" can be called directly (just copy CyberShow and CyberTVPlayer to your C: directory) (full version only)
- * SlideShow-Presentation function in conjunction with CyberShow Pro (full versions ← only)
- * Configurable ARexx command line, usable also for external viewers (full version ← only)
- * Editable file comment (full version only)
- * Save functions to convert pictures into different 24Bit file formats (full version only)
- * Direct transfer functions for several image processing programs (full version)
- * Creation of preview files (files containing reduced size images) for faster access to frequently needed picture directories and to allow creation of a picture library with pictures located on different media (disks/CDs etc.) for easy access.
- * Creation of compact catalog files for large collections of pictures (full ← version)
- * Extensive sorting functions
- * HTML web page creation from picture collections; by this method you can also print your picture pages, if you have a web browser capable of printing! (full version)

The demo version displays in greyscale only. The loading functions of the full version are for color loading at least as fast as the loading of the demo version in greyscale. Only displaying on palette oriented screens (upto 256 colors) can be slower for color displaying due to the larger number of colors which have to be requested from the operating system.

Many more functions are planned for future versions (e.g. searching, dividing into groups, higher reduced color quality for AGA users etc.); the realisation of such functions certainly depends on the number of registrations I receive from users...

If you have suggestions for possible enhancements please include them on the registration form for your order.

1.3 Information about the supported picture file formats

PhotoAlbum can currently read the following formats directly:

- 1) IFF-ILBM (all standard formats 1 to 8Bit, EHB, HAM6, HAM8, 15Bit, 24Bit)
- 2) PhotoCD (Base format 768x512 or 512x768 (portrait); linear 24Bit RGB)
- 3) JPeg (color and greyscale; incl. progressive JPeg)
- 4) PPM/PGM/PBM (P1&P4 b&w, P5 grey, P6 color)
- 5) QRT (also known as dump format by PD raytracers as POV-Ray)
- 6) Targa (RLE compr.&uncompr. 1/8/15/16/24/32Bit; incl. interleaved)
- 7) PCX (compr.&uncompr. EGA1-4Bit, VGA 8Bit grey/Colormap and 24Bit)
- 8) BMP (uncompr. 24Bit RGB, 1Bit, 4Bit or 8Bit Colormap; RLE compressed 8Bit, 1Bit)
- 9) TIF (packbit-compr.&uncompr. 24Bit, 1-8Bit grey/Color Motorola&Intel formats)
- 10) DEEP (compr.&uncompr. IFF-DEEP 24Bit and 32Bit formats)
- 11) YUV (color 1:1:1, 2:1:1, 4:1:1 and greyscale)
- 12) VLAB raw (color 1:1:1, 2:1:1, 4:1:1 and greyscale)
- 13) RGB (IFF-RGB: RGB8 and RGBN compressed; RGB5 uncompressed)

- 14) HHsYUVSg sequence format (sequential or random access)
- 15) IFF-PBM (DPII) format
- 16) ACBM (IFF-ACBM: 1 to 8Bit, EHB, HAM6, HAM8)
- 17) FBM (8Bit grey/ColorMap and 24Bit)
- 18) Sun raster (uncompressed formats for 1Bit, 8Bit grey/ColorMap and 24Bit)
- 19) MacPaint (b&w compressed 1Bit format; datafork only)
- 20) HHsXRL formats (1-8Bit ColorMap incl. HAM6/8, 8Bit grey, 24Bit RGB compressed)
- 21) binary-EPS bitmaps (RGB and CMYK; this function is experimental)
- 22) TBCPlus frames & fields

In addition picture and animation DataTypes are supported as well (for animation DataTypes at least OS3.1 is needed). Since version 4.0 the new 24Bit datatype interface of the V43 picture.datatype is also supported (included with the Picasso 96 software; should also work with the V43 picture.datatype available for CyberGraphX, unless it has expired due to an integrated expiration date).

If you have any problems with loading pictures with DataTypes or one of the above listet formats from CD-ROMs or other media you should read the

1.4 Solutions for possible problems

1. Problems with loading certain picture formats?

If you have problems reading pictures in one of the support formats (esp. from CD-ROMs with DataTypes or PCX-VGA) and are sure, that you have enough memory free, please check the following:

- a) File systems: Some PD/ShareWare/Commercial add-on or replacement file systems (esp. CD-ROM file systems!) are buggy (e.g. they do not support some rarely used DOS functions properly). Try to copy the picture to a standard device (e.g. RAM:) and to view it from there. If this works, you know that your specific file system is buggy. For CD-ROMs I recommend to try one of the following file systems from which I have testet 1) and 2) myself:
 - 1) Original AmigaDOS OS3.1 CD-ROM file system
 - 2) AmiCD-File System V1.15 or higher
 - 3) BabelCDROM FileSystem V1.2 or higher
 Several users reported problems with "AsimCD-Filesystem 3.0"; so this seems to be an unsuitable Filesystem (maybe the newer 3.4 version supports all necessary functions). Typical unimplemented or wrong functions in filesystems are: NameFromFH (needed for Datatype access) and ExamineFH (needed for several formats, e.g. PCX-VGA).
 - b) DataTypes: Some DataTypes are instable and can crash on certain pictures with odd dimensions or incomplete pictures. I have no influence on this. If you have difficulties with certain DataTypes, look out for newer versions or contact the author of the DataTypee.
 - c) 24Bit DataType systems: The recently also supported 24Bit Datatypes can bring additional risks. My loading functions have been tested
-

with the Picasso 96-24Bit-PictureDatatype. Some certain datatypes are not compatible to the 24Bit system, which can show up in different behaviours.

In some cases it should help to switch off the 24Bit Datatype interface (settings menu) to use the old interface. The Datatype usage can also be switched off completely with the settings menu.

2. Displaying problems during horizontal scrolling on a CyberVision 64 board?

Some CyberVision 64 users have reported problems with CyberGraphX 2.12 and up (at least upto 2.15; cybergraphics.library V40.62 and 40.64) on 24Bit screens. Such problems do not occur with older libs (cybergraphics.library 40.58), other screen depths or on other boards. To work around this I have now included the option "CV64Patch" (in the settings menu), which you should try, if such problems occur on your setup. As this option can slow down displaying slightly, it should only be seen as a possible intermediate solution. Since CyberGraphX V2.18 these problems should not occur anymore.

3. Problems with setting of screenmode

Selecting a specific screenmode can be tricky on some systems. Screenmode names must always be specified in their `->exact<-` form including the right case of all letters and spaces which may be contained. The correct writing of screenmodes can usually be obtained from a screenmode requester (which is e.g. available in PhotoAlbum).

Special note for CyberGraphX users: Some screenmode names may contain a special character "\$\times\$" in the resolution. This is sometimes not the letter x, but the multiplication character \$\times\$, which can be reached by pressing Alt-X (the \$\times\$ lies optiocially a bit higher than x).

If you have problems with CyberGraphX screenmodes it may help to resave those screen specifications under new names from the "CVMode" program. This should make sure that the listed screenmode names in screenmode requesters are also accepted under those names. Otherwise it might happen (due to update processes in CyberGraphX) that the listed screen mode names differ from the internally by CyberGraphX accepted names and thus setting them as tooltypes, ENV: or shell parameters fails.

To make screenmode selection easier, the options "Width", "Height" and "Depth" exist. With these you can select a screenmode just by specifying it's dimensions. A screenmode of maximum possible color depth or the selected color depth matching the size will be searched in this case.

4. Problems with file requester hacks replacing the ASL requester (MFR)

I heard from users that MFR (at least some versions) does not support the file requester options which this program needs. If you select just a single file with MFR it seems that this gets lost (and the whole directory gets displayed). Please do not use such hacks or (if you can't live without it) select at least 2 files, which is said to work.

5. Calling external programs (CyberShow, CyberTVPlayer)

The external command calls can only work, if the commands "cybershow" and "cybertvplayer" are located in the C: directory. At least an Assign of C: should link to the viewers. A simple add-on to the path is usually not successful.

1.6 Program start from Workbench

If you start PhotoAlbum by double clicking from Workbench, you can select additional picture parameters by multiple selection of icons of pictures, drawers or whole disks (e.g. picture CD-ROMs) for automatic scanning. E.g. first click once on PhotoAlbum and then (while pressing the Shift key) double click on a CD-ROM icon to get an overview on all the pictures on the CD-ROM (Warning: Scanning a complete CD-ROM can take a long time).

If you start PhotoAlbum without a picture parameter, usually a file requester will appear. You can then choose a directory (or some files or a pattern) in the requester. After this the displaying of

thumbnails

will start immediatly in a window.

You can select both real pictures/directories or DataBase preview directories/files in the requester. The scan mode will be selected according to the first file found.

New: If you specify the "ShowDataBase" Tooltype and a valid DataBasePath pointing to a directory structure of DataBase files, the specified DataBase will be shown without showing a file requester first. You can certainly change to another directory or add additional files to the DataBase with menu functions.

By

Tooltypes

you can predefine many options for PhotoAlbum including e.g. a separate screen for PhotoAlbum or a font for the subtitles.

Since V3.0 a configuration file is supported as well, which can be saved from the program.

1.7 Program start from Shell

If you start PhotoAlbum from shell you can specify some parameters, some of which are similar to Tooltypes for WB start. In addition a configuration file saved from PhotoAlbum will be loaded first if available. It is also possible to explicitly specify a configuration file to load. If you start PhotoAlbum without a "Show" path, a path/file requester will appear after startup.

1.8 Functions in the overview window (Thumbnail window)

The overview window is used to display downscaled versions of all the found pictures (miniature pictures; also called thumbnails). It is always opened and offers the major functions of the program in menus. Some functions (e.g. page flipping) are also available by a gadget bar.

The miniature pictures (thumbnails) can be selected with the mouse like gadgets. With Shift and the left mouse button you can multi-select several thumbnails. Double click on a thumbnail opens a full size window for it. If multiple images are selected while you doubleclick on an already selected picture, picture windows for all selected pictures will be opened.

With menu functions in the thumbnail window you can

- database files. Only for viewing pictures in full size the original volumes containing the pictures are needed.
- * add a new directory/files/pattern (the old images will remain in memory)
 - * select a private screen (screenmode requester)
 - * flip between the pages (page flipping buttons and cursor keys left/right can also be used for page flipping); new: now with function for "Last page"
 - * obtain program information (this includes the user data for registered users)
 - * quit the program
-
- * select thumbnails (with "select all" you will select all files, including those which have not yet been read. With "select with preview" you select all read files for which a
 preview file
 existed on the time of the first
reading. With "select without preview" you select all read files for which
no
 preview file
 existed on the time of the first reading.
- * obtain detailed information about all selected pictures (for each selected picture an information requester will appear. You can press "OK" in the ← requester
to get information for the next picture or "Cancel" to stop the information function. The information requester contains detailed information like the full path/name, file size, picture dimensions, file type, file comment, modification date, protection-flags, picture number and wheter a
 preview file
 was available during first reading or not.)
- * open
 full size windows
 for all selected thumbnails
- * close all full size image windows
 - * sort all pictures according to path, file name, comment, file type, file size or picture dimensions:
Sorting by file path, file name, comment and file size is always possible unless loading functions are in progress.
Sorting by file type and picture dimensions is only useful after all pictures have been loaded once, as otherwise the necessary sorting information is not available for all unloaded pictures which will let those be inserted unordered before all ordered pictures.
After adding new pictures the sort order will be undefined (sort again after adding).
If you perform different sort methods one after another, the previous sorting order will be kept for pictures being equal for the new sorting criteria (example: sort first for file size, then for file type).
Default order after loading of pictures is sorted by path name.
- * copy all selected pictures into a new directory: you will be asked for a destination directory. All selected pictures will be copied in their original form into the destination directory if possible. The requester which asks for the destination is a pure directory requester, in which no files are shown nor can be selected! By default since V3.3 a warning requester will appear if a file to be copied already exists in the destination directory. You can then select between "overwriting" or "skipping" this file. The warning requester will also appear during conversion operations and can be switched off by a flag in the settings menue.
 - * delete selected pictures on disk and remove them (full version only)
 - * remove selected pictures from the thumbnail window (this function does only remove them from the internal lists; on disk they remain unchanged)
-

- * delete the preview files of all selected picture (useful e.g. for removing pictures from a DataBase if the pictures are located on CD-ROMs; this function will avoid the unnecessary delete access to the write-protected CD-ROMs)
 - * Send ARExx loading commands to ADPro, ArtEffect, PPaint, XiPaint (at least V4.0) ←
 ,
 ImageFX or Photogenics (at least V2.0); these functions work directly from the thumbnails and use the loading functions from the external programs to load the pictures into them. This should not be confused with the direct transfer functions from full picture windows, which transfer the whole image to the program directly. For the ARExx loading the external programs loaders must support the needed file formats. My
 Universal Modules
 may
 help to make this true for some of the programs.
 - * Invoke CyberShow or CyberTVPlayer for the selected pictures (you can find both of these programs e.g. on Aminet in gfx/board; to use them with PhotoAlbum they should be copied to your C: directory!). Different invocation variants (e.g. for use on separate screen with BestMode or in windows on the PhotoAlbum public screen) are available. By using CyberShow as window with the AutoScale option you can now also display extremely large pictures with few memory.
 - * -> Presentation function <- in combination with
 CyberShow Pro
 (since V8.0).
 With a
 tooltype
 in PhotoAlbum you can select special CyberShow options for the presentation (default: BM SL PF Effect BT Delay 10); the transfer of the file names is done by a script file (t:cybershow.tmp). By manual creation/editing of such scripts you can use additional powerful commands to select individual effects and delay time.
 For usage of this function CyberShow should be available in your C: directory!
 - * Invoke a user defined ARExx command for all selected pictures. This can be configured by
 Tooltypes
 . As example it is configured to call
 CyberShow as viewer (but this function is also available internally now). Please note: All ARExx command functions and external invocations are blocking PhotoAlbum until they have completed for all selected pictures.
 - * HTML web page creation (with thumbnail link pictures): (full version only) Create high quality web pages (usable for Internet) from your picture ←
 collections
 with preview thumbnails (in Jpeg or IFF), variable picture subtitles (as in PhotoAlbum) and 1 to 9 pictures in each row. Use the Internet web pages in platform independent HTML format e.g. for
 a) printing of pages with a web browser capable of printing
 b) bringing collections of pictures into the Internet
 c) viewing of your picture collections on other computer systems (like PCs) with browsers like Netscape or Explorer.
 To create web pages first select the desired pictures in PhotoAlbum (or use "select all"); for the page creation the selected preview image size and picture subtitles are relevant, so configure PhotoAlbum to your desired thumbnail size and subtitles and then start the web page creation for the selected pictures. Currently you can create web pages with thumbnail link images in Jpeg or IFF format. For platform independent use you should select Jpeg, because IFF pictures can usually not be shown on other systems. The
-

full pictures should also be in a format usable by browsers, like JPEG or GIF, but this is not relevant for the page creation itself. After selecting the HTML creation menu entry you must select the number of pictures to be located next to each other in each row of the HTML page (1 to 9). Then you have to select the HTML file name (extension .html is suggested). The thumbnail pictures will be created with the same base name (but without any extension like .html) and the additional extension _#.jpg (or _#.iff), where # is a number. Should a file already exist, you will once be asked if all file of that base name should be overwritten or not. The thumbnail pictures of the webpage will always be addressed relativ and should be always transfered together with your HTML file. The full pictures, to which the thumbnails are linked, can be addressed relative (if they are located in the HTML directory or any subdirectory) or absolute (if they are outside that directory or even on another drive). For usage on other platforms or in the internet relative addressing should be used, as absolute links are only usable local and are not platform independent. For relative links the pictures in they subdirectories are to be transfered together with the webpage (.html file) and the thumbnail files, if they are to be used on another system. For absolute links it is usually neccessary to adjust the links in the .html file instead, so that they address the pictures in the right location (you can do this with a text editor for example). The created web pages contain tables of picture links and thus expect modern web browsers for correct displaying (e.g. AWeb II 3.x, Netscape 4 or Explorer 3)

- * configure the size and type of thumbnail fields (if you select "variable" size the thumbnails can use different space on the page; otherwise a fixed frame size will be reserved. The real thumbnail image size can be slightly smaller than the selected maximum field size because the special downscaled loading functions only support certain scaling stages; new: for JPEG loading you can now select if you prefer to use finer scaling stages which are slower during loading);
you can preconfigure the field size and type by
 Tooltypes
 .
 - * create
 preview files
 (for all pictures, for all selected pictures or for all newly added pictures for which no preview file was available) (full version only)
 - * select a separate
 Database directory
 for creation of the preview files;
 otherwise they will be created locally (full version only)
 - * release a selected
 Database directory
 (only possible if not used)
 - * release the cache memory for the thumbnails (the cache memory limit can now be changed in the settings menue in percent of the free memory)
 - * obtain status information for the whole set of scanned thumbnails (e.g. scanned files, unusable files, deleted files, selected files, memory usage, database path etc.)
 - * select picture subtitles (e.g. path, type, size, file comment etc.);
you can configure a font for the subtitles with
 Tooltypes
 * change settings (e.g. AutoCache in percent form of free memory, select/deselect recursive search of subdirectories, support of partial files,
-

finer (but slower) downscaled loading (currently only affects Jpeg loading), show editable file comment gadget, Jpeg saving parameters, optional warning requester before overwriting of files or quitting of the program, tooltype usage options (see tooltypes documentation for explanation) etc.)

A button allows to switch between the modes "Preload" (automatic preload of thumbnails on the next pages) and "No preload".

The stop button can be used to interrupt actions as directory scanning, preloading of thumbnails, full picture loading or preview generation.

Optional an editable file comment gadget can be included below the button bar (this can be changed in the settings menu or preconfigured by Tooltypes). The comment gadget will show the file comment of the last selected picture. You can edit the file comment in this gadget (full version only). After pressing the return key in the gadget, the new comment will be set for the last selected picture file itself and (if present) its preview file. Due to this you can also edit the comment of CD-ROM pictures if you have preview files in a separate Database directory on harddisk.

By double clicking on thumbnail images you can open full size windows which will contain the loaded pictures in full size for viewing (-> full size windows).

Any number of such windows can be open at any time (limited only be memory). Pictures can be scrolled or zoomed (magnified or downscaled) in their windows. It is even possible to open several aspects of the same image in different windows (e.g. to watch the picture in small form in one and magnified parts in other windows).

For page flipping in PhotoAlbum you can also use the cursor keys left/right.

1.9 Functions in full size picture windows

The full size picture windows can be opened e.g. by double clicking on thumbnails. Multiple windows for the same picture can be opened at the same time (to view different parts or magnification stages of a picture simultaneously).

In the full size window the following functions are available:

- * Saving of a picture in several formats (in 24Bit or 12Bit) (full version only); for Jpeg saving you can configure the quality and other options in the settings menu of the thumbnail window.
Hint: to copy a picture in original unchanged file format you can use the picture copy function from the thumbnail window; this function can be used to copy multiple selected pictures into a new directory.
 - * Transfer of the picture to image processing programs (currently ImageFX and XiPaint) (full version only)
 - * Open an additional aspect window for the current picture
 - * Close the window (with Esc key, menu function or window close gadget)
 - * Close all aspect windows for the current picture
 - * Zooming functions to magnify or downscale (with menu or the keys +, -, *);
-

Usually during downscaling the window size will also be reduced, if otherwise the picture would be too small in the window. Optionally you can change a setting in the settings menu to fix the window size for this case which will leave a blank area around small pictures. This setting is also saveable.

- * Scrolling functions (with scrollbars or the cursor keys; together with Shift the cursor keys do smooth scrolling; together with Alt they perform a jump to the border of the picture)

Depending only on your available memory an unlimited number of picture windows can be open simultaneously.

1.10 The preview, Database & Catalog concept

For faster access to often used picture directories or to build a database of pictures across many disks/CDs PhotoAlbum offers a powerful preview and database concept. For different needs PhotoAlbum offers three different concepts:

1. Local preview storage
2. Global preview database
(individual files)
3. Global preview catalogs
(compact catalog file)

Independent of the used concept you can select between different preview picture storage formats which suite different needs (low disk space usage or high access speed):

-> Preview file variants
(compression type etc.)

Global preview catalogs can currently only be constructed from existing preview files (both local previews and database previews can be used). For this purpose you first have to create such previews. This also allows the selection of various preview file variants for different pictures.

For preview file creation the selected field size will be used. The field size has great influence on the size of the created preview files. If you select a large field size, more room is needed on your harddrive. On the other hand the selected file size during creation is the upper bound for later thumbnail viewing. It is possible to view thumbnails stored in a big field size in smaller form, but not in the other way. You can still certainly at a later stage recreate new preview files in a bigger field size. For recreation of the files the original images will always be used so that changes from smaller to bigger sizes or from lower to higher quality are possible.

The thumbnail preview file creation is started with the menu entries "Save thumbnail previews". You can choose to create preview files

"for all files", "for selected files" or "for new files". New files means all such files for which no preview file existed during directory scanning. Before the actual creation of preview files you will be asked for the

preview file format

to use. The creation can

take a long time because all pictures will be read in their original form. You can stop the process with the "Stop" button. Other operations like page flipping are not possible during preview file creation. If a fatal error (like "Volume full") occurs during preview file creation, the preview file creation process is stopped automatically.

Please note that the preview file creation can not be started while loading functions are still in progress. You can deselect the "preloading" or press the "Stop" button to end all loading and then start the desired preview file creation.

If PhotoAlbum is not in DataBase mode, the preview files will be created with the extension ".pre" directly in the picture directories (

Local preview storage

). By selecting a separate preview

database directory ("DataBase save directory") you can enforce the

DataBase mode

. In this case the preview files will be created in subdirectories of the selected DataBase directory. The absolute picture path (incl. volume name) will be split into subdirectories and recreated in the preview directory. During selection of the DataBase directory you can specify a new (not yet existing) directory in the ASL requester to create a new directory.

For later access to the "Picture DataBase" you can select the preview directory or any of its subdirectories for viewing. You can also create several preview directories for different purposes and use them independently. For viewing of DataBase directories you should note that subdirectories will only be searched if you have not disabled that feature in the settings menu or by a Tooltype.

Former users of my EGSPhotoAlbum program should also read the special

side-grader tips

.

1.11 Local preview storage

The local preview file concept is useful if you have directories of pictures on a harddrive and often make changes to these directories. The preview files will be stored together with the original pictures in the same directory. They get the additional file extension ".pre". By saving the preview files into the directories the access to such directories can be accelerated very much (depending on the chosen preview format).

Advantages of local storage:

- + Pictures and corresponding preview files are always kept together, so that no confusion should appear
- + Pictures can be renamed, moved, copied or deleted together with their corresponding preview files without problems (e.g. by Shell or directory utilities; the preview files will always remain valid as long as they have the same name as the picture followed by the extension ".pre").

Disadvantages of local storage:

- Not suitable for CD-ROM directories (unless you have virtually writable CD-ROM file systems)
- The original picture directories are extended by the preview files
- For viewing of the preview files (thumbnails) the original disk volume must be present which contains the full pictures as well.

Unless you select a separate "DataBase save directory" or choose an existing DataBase directory for viewing, PhotoAlbum will start in local mode and will save preview files locally.

In local mode PhotoAlbum displays the picture numbers in the form "Pics #1 to #..." in the status field.

1.12 Global preview database

The global database concept is useful, if you have large collections of pictures on multiple volumes (e.g. CD-ROMs) and want to access them globally from a central point. The preview files will be saved independent of their original source in a central directory structure; they receive the file name of the original picture during creation and will be created in subdirectories which resemble the original picture path (including the volume name). Anyway, the directory pathes of the preview files are of no importance for later use because the original picture path is integrated into the preview file itself. The distribution of the preview files across subdirectories in the preview directory is only done to avoid name conflicts if different pictures with the same name exist in different directories or on different disks. On the other hand, the file name itself is relevant and must be identical to the file name of the original picture to allow identification.

Advantages of the database storage:

- + Preview files are stored collected in a separate directory structure (e.g. on your harddisk)
- + Access to all preview pictures in the database is possible without availability of the original disk which contains the full size picture; only if you want to access the full-size picture the disk is needed and will be requested by the system.
- + Pictures from varying sources can be managed together; even for large picture collections from CD-ROMs this preview concept is usable.

Disadvantages of database storage:

- Overview about connections between preview files and corresponding picture disks can be difficult

- Operations such as rename or move of the original pictures can break the link to the corresponding preview file. Also moving the preview file is not useful, because only the internally stored path is used to find the original picture; but it is possible to rename the original picture and the preview file in the same name, as long as the directory of the original picture is not changed.

To activate the the database modus you must either select a "DataBase save directory" or load thumbnails from an already existing DataBase for viewing. In this case you can add further pictures by "add directory". A directory will only be accepted as DataBase directory for reading if there are NO other files in the directory than preview files. If you just select a database directory for reading and than add other pictures with the "Add directory" function, you can only create previews for those new files if you select a database directory for saving first (this is because PhotoAlbum can not know in which of the used database directories it should create your preview files). Only if you have defined a Database directory in the

WB-Tooltypes

you don't have to specify

a saving directory manually.

In database mode PhotoAlbum displays the picture numbers in the form "DB-Pics #1-#..." in the status field.

To leave the DataBase mode you have to select a "New Directory" which contains no database preview files. If no database files have been loaded or saved, you can also leave the Database mode by a menu function. This will be necessary if you have preconfigured a database directory in the

Tooltypes

, because in this case always Database mode will

be used at first after directory selection.

1.13 Global preview catalogs

Since V2.2 PhotoAlbum supports compact catalog files which can ←
contain

many thumbnails. They are a special form of the

Global preview database

and can thus contain thumbnails from different media.

Global preview catalogs can currently only be constructed from existing preview files (both local previews and database previews can be used). For this purpose you first have to create such previews. This also allows the selection of various preview file variants for different pictures.

The catalog creation can be started by menu functions for all or all selected pictures. If you select pictures for which no preview files exists you will get a warning message. Before creation of the catalog you will be asked for the file name (and path) for the catalog. You can select

- a) a new file name to create a new catalog file

- b) an old catalog file name to extend or replace that catalog file;
in this case you will be asked which action should be taken upon the file.

Important: During extension of catalogs the thumbnails will simply be added to the end of the file; a check of the integrity of the catalog does not occur. It is not useful to extend a catalog by thumbnails which are already included in the catalog, because it is only possible to access the first picture of several pictures with exactly the same path and name.

As it is possible that after extension of a catalog the pictures are not stored in it in sorted order anymore, later access of the catalog can be slowed down. Due to this it may be useful to later copy such a catalog with PhotoAlbum into a new catalog; this will sort all pictures again for maximum speed at later usage of the catalog.

Catalogs are most useful for directories which are not changed at all (no new pictures or deletion of old pictures desired). Deletion of thumbnails in catalogs is not possible, but you can select some thumbnails of old catalogs (even from different catalogs simultaneously) to create a new catalog without problems.

As catalog files contain full path and file names, the name and directory of the catalog itself are of no importance. Anyway, it is recommended to use the extension ".kat" for all catalog files to allow identification by file name. Catalog files also include the complete file comments for all pictures. Changing of this comments is possible with the usual function in PhotoAlbum.

Advantages of the catalog storage:

- + One compact file can contain thousands of thumbnails; the scanning of such catalogs will be much faster than scanning of large directory trees. The reading of the thumbnail images itself will not be faster.
- + It is possible to easily divide large collections of pictures into several groups (e.g. for specific themes). This allows better access to large collections e.g. of many CDROMs.
- + Catalog files can be selected for viewing in the same way as database preview files in the file requester. You can select multiple catalogs or even directory trees of catalogs. It is also possible to view both catalogs and single database files or pictures simultaneously in PhotoAlbum. The setting for recursive search of subdirectories only influences the search of the catalog files itself, not the thumbnails in the catalogs. For a loaded catalog always all contained thumbnails will be read.

Disadvantages of the catalog storage:

- Overview about connections between catalog files and corresponding picture sources can get lost.
 - Operations such as rename or move of the original pictures can break the link to the corresponding catalog.
 - Deletion of single pictures from catalogs is not possible; instead a new catalog must be created from the remaining pictures, which is possible without problems (Warning: you must not select the original catalog file for the new file as the original file
-

would then be deleted before the thumbnails would have been copied to the new catalog!).

1.14 Preview file variants

PhotoAlbum currently creates all preview files in the "HPr2" format which can be used both for local storage and for database storage. (for reading it also supports the old HPre-format).

This format is very flexible and allows the storage of the thumbnail images in embedded form of other file formats.

Currently you can choose one of the following variants, which all have their own advantages and disadvantages:

1. PPM-P6: fast 24Bit format (for fast harddisks); uncompressed (-> large disk space needed) but full picture quality
2. IFF-ILBM 24Bit: slower 24Bit format; packbit-compressed (but only moderate compression); full quality
3. Targa 24Bit: fast 24Bit format; RLE compressed (but only moderate compression); full quality
4. HHTC24L: medium fast 24Bit format; compressed (compression power depending on kind of picture; best suited for raytracing pictures); light quality loss (nearly invisible)
5. IFF-RGBN: Fast 12bit format; compressed (power depending on kind of picture); quality loss for TrueColor pictures in color area
6. JPeg: very slow 24Bit format; highly-compressed; quality loss (also visible) possible; for JPeg you can select the saving quality and optimization in the settings menu of the main window. You could also select "Progressive JPegs" but this is not recommended because it can slow down loading even more.

More powerful preview file formats are planned, esp. for compact storage in reduced color quality (useful for AGA users).

Catalogs are saved in "HPrK" format which contains a collection of thumbnails in extended "HPr2" format.

1.15 EGSPhotoAlbum side-grader tips

The old EGS-PhotoAlbum used only one kind of preview files (with the extension ".pre"). This could be used locally and in separate paths; an independent access to separately saved preview files was not possible, which made this concept difficult to use.

The old preview files can be read from the new PhotoAlbum if they are stored locally together with the pictures (on the other way it is not possible for EGSPhotoAlbum to read preview files created with the new PhotoAlbum because it uses an extended file format).

The new PhotoAlbum does not support the old separate path concept because this was seen as too complicated and not flexible enough. Instead the new PhotoAlbum now offers the more powerful DataBase concept and the flexible Catalog file concept. As this needs absolute path names inside the preview files it is not possible to use old preview files for this. A recreation of preview files for DataBase use is needed in this case.

1.16 Configurability

You can configure PhotoAlbum by many Tooltypes and save current menu settings as configuration file. For start from shell a set of

shell parameters

is available in PhotoAlbum. The Tooltypes are predefined in the icon but partially deactivated by parantheses (). To activate such a tooltype you should remove the parantheses and possibly fill in a needed parameter as well. Changing of the Tooltypes can be done with the Workbench menu function "Information" while the PhotoAlbum icon is activated.

In the configuration file e.g. the following parameters are saved: menu settings (options and such), window position and size (layout and last full picture window), cache size, field size/type and screenmode (if selected by screenmode requester or Width/Height/Depth tooltypes). The Path, Font and Name tooltypes can currently not be saved in the configuration file. If a screenmode should be saved in the config file, it must currently be selected by screenmode requester or the Width/Height/Depth tooltypes. On program start the configuration file "photoalbum.cfg" is searched at first in ENV:. If it is missing there, it is searched in the program directory. On saving you can choose to save only in ENV: (for use until next Reset) or in the program directory and ENV:. In the Tooltypes you can choose by "TooltypePriority" that the Tooltypes should have priority before the configuration file settings. In this case the flag options (which correspond to parameterless tooltypes) are not read from the settings file but set or cleared according to the tooltypes. Only the settings which need parameters and are left out in the Tooltypes or additional information (like window position or screenmodes selected by requester) will then be read from the configuration file.

The following tooltypes are supported for start from Workbench:

Screenmode=name Open a separate screen with the specified screenmode (e.g. Screenmode=NTSC:HighRes Interlace); the screen will be opened in max. color depths which is available for that size (TrueColor under CyberGraphX; upto 256 colors on AGA). The screen will become public under the name PhotoAlbum.

Width=screen width Use best available mode with specified width if possible

Height=screen height Use best available mode with specified height if possible

Depth=depth Use best available mode with specified color depth if possible (depth must be the number of bitplanes for the screenmode, e.g. 8 for 256 colors, 15 or 16 for high color etc.)

-> Width, Height and Depth will override any specified screenmode or public screen options; Use Width, Height and Depth if you have difficulties with screenmode names (e.g. under CyberGraphX)

PublicScreen=name Use the named public screen of another program
(e.g. PublicScreen=Photogenics)

CyberShowOpts=options Use the specified option when invoking CyberShow for
slideshow presentations (see CyberShow documentation for
possible options); default: BM SL PF Effect BT Delay 10
Please note: To run the presentations on the PhotoAlbum
screen (public screen) you should leave out the BM option.

ExternalARexxPort=port Use the named port for the user definable ARexx command.
Example: ExternalARexxPort=REXX
can be used to send a command to ARexx itself.

ExternalARexxCMD=comm. Use this user defined ARexx command. The command should
contain %s as placeholder for the full path name of the
pictures.
Example: ExternalARexxCMD="address command 'cybershow %s bm sl'"
can (with REXX as port) be used to start a shell command,
in this case CyberShow in BestMode&SlideShow mode.
Please note: Currently PhotoAlbum will be blocked until
the command returns.

1.17 System requirements

PhotoAlbum should be usable on all Amigas and Dracos with

- + OS3.0 or higher
- + sufficient memory (about 4MByte Fast-RAM are recommended as minimum)

For displaying in TrueColor/HighColor quality you also need

- + cybergraphics.library V40 or higher and a suitable graphic board (Cybergraphics is a Workbench emulation/True color software extension which is usable in conjunction with several graphic boards as the Cybervision, Piccolo, SD64, Picasso, Retina-BLTZ3, Spectrum, Domino. It is Copyright by Thomas Sontowski and Frank Mariak. There also exist compatible systems from other developers, like the "Picasso 96 software" from Villagetronic; this should also allow TrueColor.)

Please note: The Draco computer already contains a built-in graphic board so that you can display in TrueColor/HighColor without additional hardware.

For usage of PhotoAlbum an Amiga with AGA-Chipset or a graphic board or a Draco is recommended.

1.18 Shareware modalities

PhotoAlbum is Shareware. This means that you have to register with me, the author, and pay a shareware fee if you want to use PhotoAlbum for more than 4 weeks. The unregistered version does also contain some restrictions (the most important: all pictures will be displayed in greyscale only!). After registration you receive a keyfile together with the latest full version. The keyfile disables all restrictions. The keyfile concept allows you to use later demo version (which can e.g. appear on Aminet) as full versions.

As PhotoAlbum is part of the PhotoAlbum/
CyberShow
complete package,
it can only be ordered in form of the package.
