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1.2 Fucking Fast Login v1.4 by Glen Martin of GREMLiNS BBS

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GREMLiNS BBS +61-7-3807-6884 (24 Hrs)
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Create a directory called "intro" in the doors dir. This dir (intro) is renamed to "intro_ffl" when FFL is first run and renamed back when FFL_2 is run. All doors (the executables only) are placed in this "intro" dir, as well as remaining in their normal dir's or paths, if you need 'em.

For each door run via "Intro/Maindoor.text" you must alter it's path and have each door (the executable) run from the new path if you want FFL to skip them. See "Intro/Maindoor.text" for self explanation.

Example: intro/wall

In brief, when FFL is run, it renames the dir to "intro_ffl" and each of the doors are not located because the path name has changed, thus each of the doors in "intro" path are skipped. ..Understand? ;)

For FFL axs to Users, place thier name in the "FFL.users" file (see eg.). The "FFL.menu" can be altered if you desire, but why bother, it's cool?!

Last thing, place the following lines in your logoff script as this will ensure that if the "intro" dir has been renamed to "intro_ffl", that it is indeed changed back (incase FFL_2 missed it?):

```
if exists doors:intro_ffl
rename doors:intro_ffl doors:intro
endif
```

And that should be about it, hopefully..!?! ; -)
