

1.3 Introduction

Introduction:

UserID keeps track of the past number of callers that YOU define. Also the output is 100% configurable. There are many text sequences (\sim u_) which display a callers actions while on-line. They include messages posted, download, and upload information. Every field can be configured to a specific length and can

be left or right justified. UserID will create an environmental variable called User_X (X being the line number) which will hold the on-line user's name. This environmental variable can be used for shell games and other applications where the username is not readily available, see the included examples. The environmental variable is also used by the TimeOn door. The TimeOn door displays the total on-line time.

1.4 UserID's Many Features

Features

- 100% configurable text files.
- definable field lengths with justification.
- 20 text sequences including user actions, like uploads, downloads, messages posted, and many more.
- configurable number of past users.

Installation:

- efficient operation making the door transparent to the user.
- creates environmental variable with the user's name which can be used for shell games.
- TimeOn door to display a user's total connect time.

1.5 Installation

Files included in the archive:

1) UserID/UserID ====> UserID Last Caller (Door File)
2) UserID/TimeOn ====> Calculates on-line time (Door File)
3) UserID/UserID.DAT ====> Datafile used by UserID.
4) UserID/Text/UserID.txt ====> Sample Config File for text output
5) UserID/UserID.gr1 ====> Sample Config File for graphics output.
6) UserID/UserID.guide ====> UserID Documentation.

Place the above files in a Directory Called UserID in the Doors Path configured in MEBBSNet.

****Note: UserID uses the Doors Path as DEFINED IN MEBBSNet, you MUST have this configured correctly. This documentation will assume that you have it configured for 'DOORS:'. If you have it configured otherwise just remember 'DOORS:' refers to the path defined IN MEBBSNet.

1.6 Configuring UserID

Configuring MQwkID:

The configuration of MQwkID is accomplished through the command line. To change the configuration specify the 'CONFIG' option with the following parameters:

```
SYSOP (Flag - Optional)
```

If this flag is present, the sysop's logon's will be displayed in the list.

```
HANDLES (Flag - Optional)
-----
```

If this flag is present, Handles will be used instead of the real names in the output display.

```
ENTRIES (Required)
======
```

This option IS REQUIRED and it defines the number of entries the list should contain.

```

A.DOORS:UserID/> UserID CONFIG ENTRIES 10

If this was entered at the command line, 10 entries would be saved, using real names, and the sysop's name would be excluded from the list.

```
B.DOORS:UserID/> UserID CONFIG HANDLES ENTRIES 5
```

If this was entered at the command line, 5 entries would be saved, using handles, and the sysop's name would be excluded from the list.

```
C.DOORS:UserID/> UserID CONFIG HANDLES SYSOP ENTRIES 15
```

If this was entered at the command line 15 entries would be saved, using handles, and the sysop's name would be INCLUDED with the list.

1.7 Configuring the UserID.[txt] Files

Configuring the UserID.[txt] file:
```

UserID uses text files similar to that of MEBBSNet. This allows for 100% customization. The default extension of '.txt' is used when a given graphics file does not exist. Graphics files have the extension of '.gr#', where '#' is the number of the user's graphics mode. See MEBBSNet documentation for more details.

Any text file may contain embedded control sequences which insert certain information. MEBBSNet text control sequences DO *NOT* work in these text files, instead the following sequences are used.

The following sequences are only valid if the last user's are being listed. This line *MUST* be preceded by the prefix '#USR' (Case Sensitive). This will alert UserID that you want this line REPEATED for the last user's information. This line can only appear ONCE in each text file.

*** These text sequences REQUIRE that the UserID program is run with the option 'update'. The best way to accomplish this is to have the UserID program run in your LogOff~script, as specified in MEBBSNet.

Notes:

UserID DOES \star NOT \star place [CR/LF]'s after the end of the line. UserID will ONLY place a [CR/LF] where the ~ur sequence is found. This allows for maximum configuration abilities.

You *MUST* have the author and version sequences somewhere in the text file. If they are not present, they will be added to the end of the text file!

The fields are padded and truncated to the width specified after the text sequence.

All numeric text sequences are RIGHT justified and all string sequences are LEFT justified. To change the default justification, place a negative field width after the option. For Example if a field is left justified and it has a width of 10, it can be right justified with a width of 10 if a -10 is specified for the field width after the option.

1.13 Other Doors by Jason Gouger

Other Doors by Me:

MQwkID [V1.00]

MQwkID is an external door for the MEBBSNet Profession BBS software that creates standard QWKMail packets. MQwkID has many features including autopacket naming, multiple message area downloads, hidden mode operation, and much more. MQwkID also serves as a reply packet tosser directly through the door or from the command line.

PathID [V1.00]

PathID is a small utility to ensure all of the file, message, and system directories have been created. If a missing directory is encountered PathID will prompt to create the missing directory if desired. This is an excellent utility for first time setups, and when creating new file or message areas.

CDRomID [V1.02]

Allows users to search CD-Rom Index file(s) for a string, and of course it has the ability to the allow direct downloading of files from the CD-Rom. It also includes the ability to make file(s) FREE for download, or have them charged against the users account. It now has Multiple CD-Rom support, and a temporary download directory option has been added.
