Strip Poker for Windows runs on an IBM PC or compatible with a SVGA monitor in 640x480x256 resolution under Microsoft Windows 3.1 (16-bit) or Microsoft Windows 95 (32-bit). This particular demonstration package is for Windows 3.1 systems.

If you would like a demonstration package for Windows 95, download STRIP9.EXE from the Card Games library in the GAMERS forum on CompuServe, or you can find a copy on my WWW home page. My URL is http://www.harborside.com/home/b/bhaynes. Note that both programs look exactly alike as you are playing the game. The only difference is that the Windows 95 version takes advantage of the 32-bit operating system.

Installation

To install Strip Poker for Windows:

From the Microsoft Windows Program Manager, choose Run from the File menu and type:

c:\work\setup

Note: In both cases, replace **c:\work** with the path that you were in when you ran STRIP3 or STRIP9.

Once the installation is complete, you can delete the files in the c:\work directory.

To keep the size of this demonstration package as small as possible, I have only included one opponent file. You can view all of the available opponents with the Microsoft Paint program and the BMP files provided.
