Introduction

The KSC Souvenir Screensaver is an easy-to-use, versatile Windows-based application. It is also compatible with other CyberView USA Screensaver collections, and is able to combine and display images from their libraries (such as the Kennedy Space Center series: "KSC Visitor Complex", "KSC Wildlife", "KSC Spacecraft", "KSC Space Shuttle", and "KSC Moon Missions").

This Screensaver program is simple to install on your personal computer and even simpler to operate! You can operate it 'as-is' or use quick and easy 'point-and-click', 'drop-and-drag' mouse commands to 'customize' your souvenir image collection! You can add or delete images to your collection, view them one-at-a-time, or establish an order for automatic, sequential image display in a 'presentation' mode.

The screensaver also features password protection - to prevent unauthorized use of your PC if you've briefly stepped away!

Features

Ease of Installation and Use - just click on 'File', then 'Run', from the Windows Program Manager. The Screensaver self-installs, ensuring proper Windows configurations are maintained.

Screensaver Mode - the Screensaver presents selected images from your personal image collection in the default sequence or a 'custom' sequence you have specified. The screensaver activates on a 'delayed-time' basis. You can custom set the delay time anywhere from one to ninety-nine minutes. You can even 'jump' between stand-alone and screensaver modes by simply pressing the 'ESC' key.

Presentation Mode - the Screensaver can be operated as a stand-alone Windows application by clicking on the 'KSC' Icon. Using the 'Button Bar' in the lower right-hand corner, you can navigate forward or backward through your selected images, or jump to the beginning or end of the specific image sequence being presented. With another click of the mouse, image description are displayed in a movable dialog box.

Image Settings - in screensaver mode, automatically vary the default time each images is displayed, select holding times from 15 to 60 seconds, by image, independently - this allows your most favorite images to remain in view longer than others. . 'Settings' also provides you with information about your image - the number of colors contained in the image, the image height and width in pixels, and the system filename of

the image file. Clicking on the displayed image expands it to its full size so that you can see exactly what it will look like when presented on your Personal Computer via the 'presentation' or 'screensaver' modes.

Design

The Screensaver is designed to display images in a "viewport" surrounded by a "border" on your PC's color monitor.

Using the Screensaver

Clicking on the Screensaver icon brings you to the Screensaver's main dialog box. The options available to you in this area allow you to control or configure the Screensaver for either 'Screensaver' or 'Presentation' modes. *Within this main dialog box you will see the following selections:*

Active (yes/no) - activates the automatic 'Screensaver' mode. Should your PC be idle the amount of time specified in the <Delay> option below, then the screensaver will start, displaying images in your current collection. Each image will be viewable for the number of seconds specified via the 'Image Settings' option (read on please).

Delay (1 to 99 minutes) - specifies the number of minutes the PC must be idle (no one has touched the mouse or the keyboard) before automatic screensaver mode is invoked.

Library - clicking in this area presents a drop-down window showing those libraries of images currently on your PC and defined to the Screensaver. Clicking on any library name causes the image titles in that library to be displayed in the Library Contents section of the screen.

Library Contents - image titles for all images in this library are displayed. Double clicking on any image title here produces the following dialog box:

* Add This Image To Your Current Collection

(the highlighted image is added to the current collection - note it will remain in the current collection only if you click on the "OK" bar at the top right of the main dialog box)

* Add All Images In This Library To Your Current Collection

(all images in the selected library will be added to the current collection)

* View All Images In This Library

(provides a 'proof-sheet' view of all images in the current library - double clicking on an image causes it to fully display)

* Delete This Image From Library

(the image referenced in the library is <logically> deleted from the viewer - the Screensaver is not capable of physically deleting files from your PC, and this is considered a safety-feature of the Screensaver)

Collection Contents - image titles for all images in this collection are displayed. Double clicking on any image title here produces the following dialog box:

* Delete This Image From Your Collection

(the highlighted image alone is deleted from the current collection)

* Delete All Images From Your Collection

(all images listed in the current collection will be deleted - this allows you to recreate/revise/install new images to the current collection, or to simply change the order of display within the current collection)

* View All Images In This Collection

(provides a 'proof-sheet' view of all images in the current collection - double clicking on an image causes it to fully display)

* Image Settings

(screen holding time - the amount of time in seconds, 15 to 99, that an image is displayed on your computer screen when the Screensaver is operating in 'screensaver' mode can be set here - additionally, other information on the image is provided: its filename and filetype, the number of colors in the image, and the actual screen dimensions of the image file in pixels)

Password Protection

(you can set a personal password for 'Screensaver' mode)

\mathbf{OK}

(saves all current dialog box settings - if 'Active' is marked 'yes' then after the specified delay the Screensaver will enter screensaver mode, displaying the images as listed in your current collection - each image will display for the amount of time specified in individual image settings - note 15 seconds is the minimum display time for an image, 1 minute is the minimum delay time prior to screensaver automatic start)

Run

(starts the Screensaver in 'presentation' mode whereby you can step through your current collection one image at time, forward or backward, jumping to the start or the end of the collection - note the 'Button Bar' on the lower right-hand corner of the screen - the 'arrows' control the jumping, the 'bookpage button' allows you to view the image description for the image being displayed, the 'X button' exits presentation mode, note - depressing the escape key "Esc" on your keyboard will cause the Screensaver to switch from presentation to screensaver modes, and vice-versa. Depressing any key other than 'Esc' when in screensaver mode will return you to the main dialog box)

Border

(allows you to select a desired 'border' color for the screen area surrounding the

image displayed)

About

(license agreement and system information - be sure to read - important stuff!)

Help

(the file you are reading)

Exit

('exits' the Screensaver, any changes made since last clicking on 'OK' are discarded)
