Creating a self-extracting archive

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

Self-extracting archives are basically archives that do not need the archiver program (such as ZipIT!) to extract the files. This may be useful if you are sending the archive to someone who does not have a ZIP archiver program.

Self-extracting archives have extensions of **.EXE** and when run as a command, the files in the archive are extracted automatically.

Click on '**Action**'-'**Make**' or right-click to bring up the popup menu and choose 'Make'.

This operation requires an external program called **zip2exe.exe**, which is available in the Pkzip package. It is best that you place this file in your search path such as c:\dos or c:\windows.

Creating a UUEncoded File

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

1. Choose '**File**'-'**New**' from the menu. Or click on the '**New**' button.
2. In the '**Create New UUE File**' dialog, type in the name of the new uuencoded (.uue) file.
3. Choose '**Action**'-'**uuEncode**' from the menu. Or click on the '**Encode**' button.

Tip: To choose '**File**'-'**New**' from the menu, you may press '**Alt**'-'**F**' and then press '**N**'.

Introduction to ZIP archives

What is a ZIP archive?

An archive is a file that contains one or more files. The files in an archive are usually compressed. There are several different archive formats available. The most common format used today is the ZIP format.

Zip IT! is a ZIP archiver program that allows you to create these ZIP files.

Benefits of an archive

Archives enable files to be grouped together easily, and facilitates the copying of these files to other computers.

Secondly, it saves a lot of disk space. Compression ratios differ depending on the type of data compressed. A typical text file that is about 2,000 bytes can shrink to 1,000 bytes after compression. A Microsoft word document that is about 1,000,000 bytes can shrink to less than 100,000 bytes after compression! If you transmit the file through a telephone line, you will save time and money because of the smaller size.

Thirdly, only one archive file needs to be sent to the receiving party, instead of dozens of files.

Typical uses

Files distributed on the Internet, bulletin boards and online services like Prodigy, AOL and CompuServe are usually distributed as archives. You need a program such as **Zip IT!** to extract the files from the archives.

Introduction to UUEncoded files

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

What is a UUEncoded file?

The need for UUEncoded files came about because of a limitation of the Internet. The Internet is only able to receive text files under normal protocols. To send binary files, such as executable files (.exe files), MS Word documents (.doc) etc, over the Internet requires the binary file to be converted to a text file.

Encode IT! provides this **binary-to-text** conversion in a user-friendly interface. It takes your binary file and convert it to a uuencoded file (with extension **.uue**).

Typical uses

If you are sending a binary file over the Internet, you can convert it to a uuencoded file before sending. Unix systems use uuencoding primarily. Hence, if you are sending a binary file to someone on a Unix machine, the best way is to send it as a uuencoded file.

Converting a UUEncoded file to a Normal File

1. Choose '**F**ile'-'**O**pen' from the menu. Or click on the '**O**pen' button.
2. In the '**O**pen **UUE** File' dialog, select the uuencoded (.uue) file.
3. Choose '**A**ction'-'**U**U**D**ecode' from the menu. Or click on the '**D**ecode' button.

Tip: To choose '**F**ile'-'**O**pen' from the menu, you may press '**A**lt'-'**F**' and then press '**O**'.

Encrypting the Archive

You may encrypt files within the zip file with a password. Extracting the files later will require the same password. The password string should be less than 65 characters.

Note: If you encrypt your files with a password, and later forget the password, we have no way of unlocking your zip archive.

Click on the '**File**'-'**Password**' menu to specify the password to be operational for that particular zip archive. This password will be used when using the **Add**, **Extract**, or **View** operations.

Note: The password will be cleared when the zip archive is closed. It is advisable to close the encrypted zip archive as soon as you are done with it, so that other users will not be able to view your password.

Add Dialog

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

Note: As a general rule, you should try to create your archive on your hard-disk, and then copy the archive to your diskette. This is to ensure that the zipping action is extremely fast, and that sufficient disk-space is available on your hard-disk.

'Action' provides 3 choices:

1. Add and Replace Files (recommended)
adds all specified files to the archive.
2. Refresh Existing Files
updates files already in the archive that match the specified files.
3. Update and Add Files
same as Freshen, but adds any specified files that are not already in the archive.

Compression

Determine the level of compression - the higher the level, the smaller the size of the ZIP file. For most operations, choosing **Normal** is the most appropriate.

Choose Specific Files

Select the files individually from the files listbox.

To add multiple files, you have to hold down the 'Ctrl' key while clicking on the files.

Include All Files

Select all files in the directory specified by the directory listbox.

Include File Categories

Type in the file categories to add to zip archive. For example, type ***.exe** to specify all files with extension of exe.

Include Sub-directory files

Add the files of all sub-directories. Also known as '**Recurse Directories**'.

Save Extra Directory Info

Store any actual directory path information that is in the 'Add' directory.

Store filenames in DOS 8.3 format

Convert any long filenames to the MS-DOS filename format - which specifies a maximum of 8 characters in the name portion, and 3 characters in the extension portion.

UUEncode

Option to uuencode the ZIP file immediately after the 'Add Files' operation. In this way, you do not have to use a uuencoder to convert it to a uuencoded file separately.

Password

Encrypt files within the ZIP archive with a password. Extracting the files later will require the same password. The password string should be less than 65 characters.

Note: If you encrypt your files with a password, and later forget the password, we have no way of unlocking your zip archive.

Install Dialog

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

The 'Install' feature will create a Program Group for your applications, and create Program Items for the items in the zip archive.

Directory

Specify the directory that the extracted files will be saved to.

Group Name

Specify the Program Group Name that you want the new Program Group to have. The Group Name should be unique.

Include only executables and readme files

Specify whether to add only executables (.exe & .com extensions) and README files to the group.

Extract Dialog

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

Extract To

The directory where the files in the zip archive will be extracted to.

Selected Files

Only highlighted files in the ZIP archive will be extracted.

All Files

All files in the ZIP archive will be extracted. To be able to choose the 'Selected Files' option, you have to highlight those files with your mouse button before choosing 'Extract'.

Refresh

Update existing archive files that match the specified files.

Update

Similar to Refresh, but also adds any specified files that are not in the archive yet.

Overwrite Existing Files

Determine whether you are prompted before existing files are overwritten with archive files. Unless you are very certain of the files that are to be overwritten, it is best *not* to check this option.

Use Directory Names

Determine whether directory names (pathnames) stored in the archive will be used when extracting. It is recommended that you check this option. Any sub-directories that were stored in the archive are also created.

Password

If the files in the zip archive are encrypted with a password, you need to supply this password. Otherwise, the Extract operation will fail. The password string should be less than 65 characters.

Create Dir

Create a new directory. It is recommended that you just type in the directory name in the 'Extract To' field, and the new directory will be automatically created.

Archive Management

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

You can use these features to help you manage your zip archive files.

Copy Archive

Copies the active zip archive to another directory.

Delete Archive

Delete the active archive.

Rename Archive

Change the file name of the active archive.

Options

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

Default Open Directory

Determine the default directory that is used in all Open File Dialogs. You may over-write this default directory (folder).

System Directory

default directory is set to the current directory.

Last Extract Directory

directory used during the last Open Archive session.

User-defined Directory

always use this specific directory.

Default Extract Directory

Determine the default directory that is used in the 'Extract To' field which determines the directory that the files in the zip archive will be extracted to. You may over-write this default directory (folder) when extracting the files though.

Open Archive Directory

default directory is set to the directory containing the open archive.

Last Extract Directory

directory used during the last Extract session.

User-defined Directory

always use this specific directory.

Default Add Directory

Determine the default directory when the Add dialog is opened.. You may over-write this default directory (folder) when adding the files though.

Open Archive Directory

default directory is set to the the directory containing the open archive.

Last Extract Directory

directory used during the last Add session.

User-defined Directory

always use this specific directory.

Location of Zip2EXE.EXE

The directory where zip2exe.exe is stored in. zip2exe.exe is a file that is distributed with Pkzip, and can convert a zip archive to a self-extracting executable (.exe) file.

View Files

Associated Program

View the selected file with the program associated with the document. For example, text files (.txt extensions) are usually associated with NOTEPAD.EXE.

Internet ASCII Viewer

View the selected file (text files only) with the built-in Zip-IT text viewer.

Viewer

Specify a user-defined viewer. This setting will be saved for use in the next session.

Test extract

By right-clicking on the items, you can see a popup help for it.

Test the file integrity of the active archive without actually extracting it.

Click on '**Actions**'-'**Test**' or right-click to bring up the popup menu and choose 'Test'.

Ans: you need to have sufficient disk space in your hard-disk to allow the original ZIP file to be copied to before it is worked on. This is to protect against the contingency of any damage to the zip file during any add operation, the original zip file has a backup. The temporary copy is always copied to c:\zipit\temp where c:\zipit is the directory where ZipIT! is located.

Ans: Hold down the Ctrl key while clicking on the file items.

Ans: You have to highlight the files in the listing box before choosing the operation. To highlight multiple files, press the '**Ctrl**' key while clicking on the items.

Extracting an Encrypted Archive

You must decrypt files within the zip file with the same password that it was encrypted with. The password string should be less than 65 characters.

Note: If you had forgotten your password, we have no way of unlocking your zip archive.

Click on the '**File**'-'**Password**' menu to specify the password to be operational for that particular zip archive. This password will be used when using the **Add**, **Extract**, or **View** operations.

Note: The password will be cleared when the zip archive is closed. It is advisable to close the encrypted zip archive as soon as you are done with it, so that other users will not be able to view your password.

Delete Files from Archive

Entire Archive

Delete all files from the archive.

Selected Files

Delete only highlighted files. To be able to select this option, you have to first highlight the files you intend to delete.
