Our Email Address Database just keeps growing:

The QRZ e-mail database continues to grow. We now have over **189,000** email addresses on file, the largest collection in amateur radio. If you're on the World Wide Web and would like to visit our online system, check out **<http://www.qrz.com>**

The QRZ WWW server has the most up-to-date callsign information available and is updated daily from the official FCC files. There is also a daily updated listing of all the unused 1x2 and 2x1 calls, which can be used to select a vanity callsign.

Over 12,500 Digital QSL Card Images

The digital image collection continues to grow as well. This edition brings you over 12,500 digital QSL card images. All images are instantly available as you browse through the main callsign database. You'll find a new menu item (View->Images) which you can use to view the digital QSL cards (or other images) while running QRZ.

Callsign Database Updates

This edition also includes more than 60,000 callsigns from the former Soviet block countries, now known as the CIS. This includes countries such as Russia, Estonia, Belarus, and more. In addition to our regular USA listings, we also carry Australia, Austria, Canada, Mexico, UK, Italy, Turkey, Monaco, Brazil, Portugal, Cuba, and miscellaneous listings from everywhere. Since the introduction of our online DX callsign registration form, we've begun to take on hundreds of new, exotic callsigns each month. We're still looking for more DX callsign databases, and you could qualify for a free subscription to QRZ for helping us obtain more countries.
