1.2 Arthropodicons: Required For Use

----- NOTE -----
 If you don't know what NewIcons are and don't have the software installed then you are probably wondering why there are drawers full of little white squares. You need NewIcons (Aminet: util/wb/NewIconsV4.lha) in order to make these icons appear. They use a retargetable palette system that stores the icon data in the tooltypes. Get NewIcons and read its docs for further explanation.

NEEDED:

- Amiga with OS 2.xx or better
- NewIcons system (v4 is the newest as of this writing)

RECOMMENDED:

- WB screenmode with a lot of colors and greys

1.3 Arthropodicons: What & Why?

DESCRIPTION:

This is a set of icons for use with NewIcons. They are not in the NewIcons style (isometric with little platforms and such,) but are mostly dorsal views of various arthropods, both extinct and extant,

drawn somewhat realistically.

USES:

They look nice if you leave them out on your Workbench, preferably with the NewIcons' "No Borders" setting selected. Use them as appicons. Use them as dock buttons. Use them for your hard drives. Use them as frivolous decorations. Cover your Workbench with ticks and earwigs! Drag the jumping spider around and use him to hunt the damsel fly!! Hours of salticidean fun!!!

WHY DID I DO THIS:

I have no idea.

I just started making a fly to use as a dock button, and I guess I got carried away.

1.4 Arthropodicons: List of Icons

Icons are grouped as follows:

 - Order
 - Family (if needed)
 - Species

If a specific species isn't named, then the icon is either a generic composit or I didn't know the name.

Icons that are under "Other" are the only member of their Order represented and are in the associated Class drawer, Order name is given in parenthesis.

1.5 Arthropodicons: Notes

INSTALLING:

Use the program CopyNewIcon (it should be in the NewIcons distribution,) to put the NewIcon data into an existing icon.

example:

```
CopyNewIcon Insects/Odonata/Damselfly DH0:disk.info
```

DO NOT USE ICON EDIT TO COPY A NEWICON. This will save the data in the standard format and you will lose the retargeting palette for that icon. However, if that's what you want to happen, then by all means, go ahead. Consult NewIcon's docs for further information.

COLORS:

Since these icons use the NewIcons retargetable palette system, they should work with any WB palette, but some may look ugly on a low depth WB.

It would be a good idea if your palette contained a good representation of greys, as in more than three light shades.

SIZES:

Each icon is a different size, depending on how much detail I could cram into it. I know this lack of uniformity might be disturbing to the more procrustean minded, but it is just something you will have to deal with.

Also, they are not to scale (termites are usually much smaller than scorpions... unless it's a baby scorpion... ooh how cute!)

ALTERED STATES:

Most of the icons only have a darkened version for the selected state (a la Mac) with a white line around them for contrast on dark backgrounds. Exceptions include the scorpion which will swipe its stinger at you when selected (ooh how cute!) and the firefly whose bottom becomes illuminated (don't you hate it when THAT happens.)
