NOTABLE CHARACTERISTICS: HERBACEOUS WITH LEAVES WRAPPING AROUND THE BRANCHES, AND LEAVES AND BRANCHES STARTING AT JUNCTIONS, AND STARTED ABOUT 90 DEGREES FROM THE PREVIOUS. THE LEAVES ALSO HAVE SERRATED EDGES. THE FLOWERS RESEMBLE THE SHAPE OF THE FACE OF A MONKEY.

SPECIAL INTEREST: GROWS IN NEARLY EVERY CREEK THAT IS SPRING FED, AND IF THERE IS AN ABUNDANCE OF SHADE, IT WILL GROW EVEN PRETTIER.
