SPECIAL INTEREST: IT IS A TALL GREEN TREE ALONG DESERT STREAMS. THERE IS ONLY ONE OTHER WHICH IS THE SYCAMORE TREE. ITS NAME DERIVES FROM THE COTTONY ACCUMULATION OF SEEDS, WHICH SOMETIMES RESEMBLES SNOW UNDER THE TREES.
