NOTABLE DETAILS: HERBACEOUS MULTI-STEMMED PLANT WITH BRIGHT RED ERECT PETALS PROTRUDING FROM THE TOP OF EACH BRANCH AND NARROW LEAVES AS OPPOSED TO FINGER-LIKE LEAVES.

SPECIAL INTEREST: NATIVE AMERICANS USED THESE PLANTS FOR COLORS TO COLOR FABRIC. THE INTERNAL FLOWER PARTS ARE HARD TO RECOGNIZE.
