SPECIAL INTEREST: THE PINK-PURPLE FLOWERS ARE UNIQUE, AND WHEN IN FLOWER, THE LEAVES FALL OFF MAKING THE TREE ONE COLOR. IT WAS NAMED FOR ITS LACK OF LIMBERNESS, THE SPANISH "TIESO" MEANING STIFF. IT IS SAID TO LIVE AS LONG AS 1500 YEARS, SO THEY NEED TO BE PRESERVED.
