HALOGETON GLOMERATUS

ALSO CALLED: SALTLOVER

FLOWER COLOR: GREEN

FLOWER ARRANGEMENT: IN CLUMPS OF MANY MINIATURE FLOWERS EVENLY SPACED ALONG THE MOSTLY VERTICAL STALKS

FLOWERING TIME: JULY TO AUGUST

LEAVES: NO LEAVES

NORMAL SIZE: LESS THAN 2'

NORMAL ELEVATION: 5000' TO 6000'

HABITATION: DISTURBED GRAVEL AREAS

ABUNDANCE: RARE

NOTABLE DETAILS: HERBACEOUS MULTI-STEMMED PLANT WITH MANY UPRIGHT STALKS AND BUNDLES OF MINIATURE FLOWERS ON THE SIDES OF THE STALKS

SPECIAL INTEREST: IT IS SAID TO NOT BE A NATIVE OF NORTH AMERICA BUT NEITHER IS TUMBLEWEED. IT IS CALLED A NOCUOUS, UNDESIRABLE WEED IN MANY STATES.
