HONEY MESQUITE

**SCIENTIFIC NAME:**  
PROSOPIS GLANDULOSA

**ALSO CALLED:** WESTERN HONEY MESQUITE AND TEXAS MESQUITE

**FLOWER COLOR:** YELLOW

**FLOWER ARRANGEMENT:** SMALL 1/16 " OR SMALLER LIKE MULBERRY FLOWER STALKS ONLY LONGER

**FLOWERING TIME:** MAY TO AUGUST

**LEAVES:** COMPOUND LEAVES 3" TO 6" LONG WITH SMALL 1/2" TO 1" LONG NARROW LEAFLETS

**NORMAL SIZE:** UP TO 30'

**NORMAL ELEVATION:** 1500' TO 4,000'

**HABITATION:** MOSTLY ALONG STREAMS AND DRY WASHES

**ABUNDANCE:** COMMON IN LOW PLAINS AREAS

**NOTABLE DETAILS:** TREE ABUNDANT WITH DARK GREEN SMALL COMPOUND LEAVES AND LONG SPIKES OF TINY FLOWERS

**SPECIAL INTEREST:** LONG SEEDPODS WITH BEANS, WHICH WERE USED AS FOOD
