NORMAL ELEVATION: 2000' TO 8000'

HABITATION: MOIST AREAS ABUNDANCE: COMMON

NOTABLE DETAILS: HERBACEOUS MULTI-STEMMED PLANT WITH SQUARE BRANCHES AND SMALL NARROW LEAVES IN WHORLS AROUND BRANCHES WITH ALMOST INVISIBLE HAIRS WHICH CAUSE THE PLANT TO STICK TO CLOTHING WHEN BRUSHED AGAINST

SPECIAL INTEREST: IT SOMEHOW SEEMS TO HAVE ACQUIRED ITS NAME FROM A CUSTOM OF USING IT AND OTHER SMALL PLANTS FOR BED STUFFING.
