NEW MEXICO RASPBERRY

SCIENTIFIC NAME:
RUBUS NEOMEXICANUS

ALSO CALLED: WILD RASPBERRY AND THIMBLEBERRY

FLOWER COLOR: WHITE
FLOWER ARRANGEMENT: ALONG BRANCHES
FLOWERING TIME: MAY TO SEPTEMBER
LEAVES: LARGE COMPOUND DIVIDED INTO THREE PARTS ON LONG STEMS
OBSERVABLE FRUIT: SMALL RASPBERRY LIKE FRUIT
NORMAL SIZE: UP TO ABOUT 9'
EDIBLE: RED FRUIT
NORMAL ELEVATION: 5000' TO 9000'
HABITATION: ROADSIDE AND OPEN CREVICES
ABUNDANCE: COMMON

NOTABLE DETAILS: THORNLESS BUSH THAT RESEMBLES OTHER BERRY BUSHES EXCEPT NO THORNS AND LARGE WHITE FLOWERS

SPECIAL INTEREST: FRUIT IS ONLY ABOUT ½" THICK WHENCE IT IS CALLED THIMBLEBERRY AND IT HAS VERY MILD TASTE, NOT RESEMBLING REGULAR RASPBERRY'S FLAVOR
