YELLOW WOOD SORREL

SCIENTIFIC NAME:
OXALIS DILLENII

ALSO CALLED: OXALIS STRICTA, DILLENS OXALIS, AND SOUTHERN YELLOW WOOD SORREL

FLOWER COLOR: YELLOW
FLOWER ARRANGEMENT: SEVERALLY AT ENDS OF STALKS
FLOWERING TIME: FEBRUARY TO SEPTEMBER
LEAVES: HEART-SHAPED AND THREE-LEAVED
NORMAL SIZE: 6" TO 12"
EDIBLE: YES IF IN MODERATION
NORMAL ELEVATION: ALL
HABITATION: MOIST DISTURBED AREAS LIKE GARDENS
ABUNDANCE: COMMON

NOTABLE DETAILS: HEART-SHAPED LEAVES IN THREES AND SMALL YELLOW FLOWERS
