LEAVES: TINY COMPOUND
NORMAL SIZE: NORMALLY ABOUT 6' TO 20'
NORMAL ELEVATION: UP TO ABOUT 4500'
HABITATION: HILLSIDES AND CANYONS
ABUNDANCE: COMMON

NOTABLE CHARACTERISTICS: THORNLESS BRANCHES WITH WHITE PEA FLOWERS AND TINY COMPOUND LEAFLETS

SPECIAL INTEREST: EXTREMELY COMMON IN THE ORGAN PIPE NATIONAL MONUMENT ON BOTH SIDES OF THE HIGHWAY THAT DIVIDES THE PARK
