

Mighty Morphin Power Rangers Screen Saver

Install

To install the Mighty Morphin Power Rangers (MMPR) Screen Saver and selected modules, click on SETUP.EXE. This product has over 100 images, and you may not have room on your hard drive for all of them at once. You will be given the opportunity to choose which modules you wish to load onto your hard drive. You can change modules at any time by running SETUP.EXE again. In the installation process, two files are added to your Windows directory: DEFAULT.SSI and SRNSCENE.SCR.

Uninstall

If you decide you want to remove the MMPR Screen Saver from your computer, you will need to run SETUP.EXE again from your CD-ROM as if you were going to change modules. Make sure that all the modules are unchecked. At this point, the program assumes that you wish to remove the entire program, since no images will be available. A dialog will appear telling you that the two remaining files in your Windows directory are being removed. Click OK. You have now successfully removed the program from your computer.

To be certain that you have removed the program, you can click on Control Panel in Main. Double-click on Desktop. The Screen Saver box should no longer list "Power Rangers" as an option.

Transitions

You can choose from a range of screen transitions. From Program Manager, double-click on the Control Panel icon in Main. Double-click on the Desktop icon. Under Screen Saver, single-click on the down arrow to list options. Single-click on "Power Rangers." Single-click on "Test" for a brief preview of a screen, then press the Space Bar to return to the dialogue box. Single-click on Setup to make display selections for the Mighty Morphin Power Rangers Screen Saver. Adjust Initial Display Duration to set the amount of time the original images are displayed before the transitions take effect. Adjust Final Display Duration to set the amount of time the images are displayed after the transitions have taken effect.

To select a specific transition, single-click on the button next to this option, then single-click on the transition you want. To review the transition list, use the slider bar to the right of the options. You may also choose to see all the transitions; single-click on Use Random Transition. Once you have made your selections, single-click on OK. Click on OK in the Desktop and Control Panels to return to Program Manager.

BLACK - Slowly posterizes color by color to black with a small amount of white.

BLACK FADE - Image slowly fades to black.

BLUE - Slowly posterizes to blue with black and white highlights.

COLOR CYCLE - Posterizes highlights to a variety of colors.

COLOR SHIFT - Posterizes image using a different color palette.

CYAN - Slowly posterizes to cyan with black and white highlights.

DARK PASTEL - Slowly posterizes to dark pastel shades with black and white highlights.

DARKEN - Slowly posterizes to darker shades with black and white highlights.

DISSOLVE - Crops image from top and bottom, then side to side.

FLIP - Flips the image upside down on top of existing image to produce a double exposure.

GREEN - Slowly posterizes to green with black and white highlights.

GREYSCALE TRANSITION - Slowly replaces colors with appropriate shades of gray for a black and white photo effect.

MAGENTA - Slowly posterizes to magenta with black and white highlights.

NEON - Slowly posterizes to neon with black and white highlights.

POSTERIZE - Posterizes various colors as it slowly removes all color from the image, ending with black and white.

RED - Slowly posterizes to red with black and white highlights.

WASHOUT - Slowly removes colors from the image, ending in a washout effect.

Trouble Shooting

Why won't the program install?

You may have insufficient hard disk space for the program to decompress the files it needs from the CD to your hard drive. To free up more disk space, refer to your system manual or Windows online Help function.

Video Problems

Make sure you have the latest Windows drivers for your video card. These drivers are commonly included on diskettes that come with the card. You can get updated drivers from several places, including the card manufacturer and major online services like America Online and CompuServe. To run this program, your video card must be set to 256 colors. To check this, go to Program Manager/Main. Double-click on "Windows Setup." The Display line will tell you about your computer's video card and display. If it does not call out "640x480x256," you will need to change it. Refer to your Windows manual or online help to do this.

Why doesn't the Setup program create a program group window?

The MMPR Screen Saver takes advantage of the screen saver capabilities built into Windows. All interaction with the Screen Saver is accomplished through the Desktop interface in the Control Panel.

Why don't I get any voices or sound effects when the Screen Saver is running?

The sound files included on the CD-ROM are separate from the Screen Saver and can be loaded into the appropriate area on your computer for you to assign to various applications. The Screen Saver itself doesn't make any sounds.
