Screen Pix Configuration Settings

Screen Pix allows you to customize its function and appearance to your personal taste. You do this by adjusting the configuration settings in the **Screen Pix Settings** window.

Open the Settings window either by double clicking on the **Configure Screen Saver** icon in the Screen Pix program group or, from the Windows **Control Panel**, double clicking on the **Desktop** icon and then clicking on the **Settings** pushbutton.

Screen Saver Activation Delay

The screen saver activation delay is the number of minutes that your keyboard and mouse must be idle before Screen Pix is activated.

Set the activation delay minutes in the Windows **Desktop** window. The Desktop window is opened by double clicking on the Desktop icon on the Windows **Control Panel**.

Image Duration

The number of seconds each image remains on the screen may be varied by means of a thumb wheel in the **Screen Pix Settings** window.

Password Protection

You may protect the privacy of your computer screen when you are away from your desk by enabling Screen Pix password protection. When password protection is enabled and Screen Pix is active, only you will be able to cancel Screen Pix and gain access to your computer.

To enable password protection, go to the **Password Options** box in the **Screen Pix Settings** window. Click on the **Password Protected** check box. An X will fill the check box.

To disable password protection, click on the Password Protected check box again so that the X disappears.

To choose your password, click on the **Set** pushbutton. The **Change Password** window will open.

If you have previously registered a password with Screen Pix, enter your old password in the **Old Password** box. You will be unable to change your password without first entering your old password. This prevents an unauthorized person from changing the Screen Pix password. If you have not previously registered a Screen Pix password, you can skip this step.

Move the cursor to the **New Password** box and type your new password. To make sure that you typed your new password correctly, you must next move the cursor to the **Retype New Password** box and type your new password again.

That's all there is to it. Now click on the **OK** pushbutton and your new password is registered.

Don't forget your new password!
