

A Child inherits all the features of a Parent, except the ability to make Children. No other communications application has a comparable feature.

Unlimited e-mail and file transfer

Send and receive unlimited messages and files. Files can be of any size and format: graphics files, word processing files, binary files, etc.. Create e-mail messages in FreeMail, or cut-and-paste text from another application into your FreeMail message. Or, send a message generated in another application in its native format.

World-wide Communications

FreeMail uses the most advanced techniques to insure fast accurate transmission, even on less-than-ideal phone lines. FreeMail is currently being used on phone systems throughout the world--from Indonesia to Columbia, from Japan to Switzerland.

Easy-to-use interface

Our customers tell us that FreeMail is easier to use than any other communications package. The interface is intuitive, and pleasant to use. The on-line Help system, which is inherited by all Child copies, makes it very easy to learn. FreeMail can be used as a simple program to do simple e-mail tasks, or as a powerful tool to handle complex information distribution.

Easy automated installation

FreeMail is easy to set up. It takes care of all the technical aspects of site and modem set-up, making it easy for non-technical people to set up a site or an entire network. The entire application, whether Parent or Child, fits on one disc. We have provided a one page Quick-Start Reference for getting your Child sites going without a manual. You can either print it from your on-line Help, or copy it from your User Manual. Distribute it with Child discs to aid installation. All Child sites have full on-line Help.

Custom Cabinets

The Custom Cabinets feature allows you to easily organize mail in custom categories. Sort your mail any way you want-by project, by company, by subject, by date, etc.

Persistent Mail

You can set up Persistent Mail to automatically transmit a message or file to any site that calls you. You can also set it up to transmit to any site that you call. Combined with other features, such as Send Only Updated Files, and Automatic Timed Site Polling, Persistent Mail is a flexible powerful feature.

Compression

FreeMail automatically compresses a file before it is transmitted, and de-compresses it at the receiving end. For example, most MS Word documents are compressed about 80% by FreeMails aotomatic compression. This makes FreeMail transmission very fast, especially with todays fast modem speeds. In terms of cost alone, FreeMail is an attractive alternative to regular mail, fax, and overnight delivery for any type of documents, from binary software files, to graphics files, to legal documents.

Encryption and Security FreeMail provides a high level of privacy and security. Unlike Internet or commercial services, you control access to your network. Any message or file can be automatically encrypted so that **nobody** can open it without the password you assign. Because each FreeMail disc, whether Parent or Child, has a unique ID number, there is no chance of mis-directed mail, even if two sites have the same name.

Certified Mail

If you designate an outgoing message as Certified, the receiving site automatically generates a Confirmation message when the Certified message is opened. You can keep track not only of when an important message was received, but also when it was read. High priority items can also be designated as **Urgent**.

Timed Sending (Polling) and Receiving

You can set up your site to automatically call other sites at specified times. You can broadcast messages when long-distance rates are lowest, or you can transmit large files when the phone line will not be needed for voice calls. (See the LogicAnswer feature for more info on having FreeMail share a single phone line with an answering machine or fax). You can use Polling to collect mail, or to keep any site updated with the latest information automatically.

You can also set up your FreeMail site to receive calls only at specific times. This feature, along with LogicDial and LogicAnswer, is designed for small bussinesses that do not have dedicated phone lines for FreeMail.

Launch other Applications from within FreeMail

You can view a received file without leaving FreeMail. Simply choose Open from a dropdown menu, and FreeMail will automatically find the appropriate application and open the selected file. Any file format can be viewed if you have the associated application on your computer. Typical supported formats are.BMP and .PCX format for graphics files, and .DOC or .TXT format for text files.

Run FreeMail in background

You can send and receive messages while you do other work on your computer. FreeMail has a number of ways to let you know that you have new mail, even when FreeMail is minimized--the FreeMail bird icon changes to a glowing letter icon, and theScroll Lock LED on your keybourd blinks (so you know if you have new mail even if your screen is turned off).

LogicDial and LogicAnswer

This unique technology enables FreeMail to share a phone line with an answering machine or a fax. No dedicated computer or dedicated phone line is needed to run FreeMail all the time. Because a FreeMail transmission has a unique distinctive ring pattern, your FreeMail site distinguishes voice messages from FreeMail messages. Voice messages are sent to the telephone or answering machine, and FreeMail messages are picked up by your computer. Thus, there is no need for a voice/data switch, (which can cost much more than your entire FreeMail network!) No other software application has a comparable feature.

Remote Access from portable computer

FreeMail Call Home is a special version of FreeMail that allows remote access to the Parent site from a second computer. This feature is great for people with two offices, people who use portable computers, and travellers. FreeMail Call Home sites have all the standard FreeMail features.

Routed Network




Seamless communication between Mac and Windows

Internet button

By pressing this button you will call either FreeMail's **UUCP gateway**, or your own Internet UUCP gateway. Press this button to send and receive Internet Mail.

Read Mail button

Press this button to open the message that is highlighted in the Message List. The Read Mail dialog box will appear with the selected message.

Write Mail button

Press this button to compose a message to the site or group highlighted in the Send To area. The Compose Mail dialog box appears. When composing mail, you can use FreeMails cut-and-paste features to edit text, or to bring in text from another application.Many options are available in the Compose Mail dialog box--Lock, Certify, Urgent, Forward,Reply, Hold, Attach Files.

Select Files button

Press this button to select files to send to other sites. You can send files of any size or type. You can send files from any directory or drive on your computer.

Call Now button

Press this button to establish modem-to-modem contact with the site highlighted in the Send To area. If a group is highlighted, the member sites will be called sequentially. Transmission is two-way, so mail and files will be sent AND received. You can call a site to pick up mail, even if you are not sending anything.

Receive Mail button

Press this button to make your site receptive to incoming calls. Most users leave this function active all the time. Transmission is two-way, so mail and files will be received AND sent. If Site X calls you, any mail you have for site X in your Waiting-To-Be-Sent queue will be transmitted.

Make A Child button

Use this button to make Child copies, and distribute them to anyone with whom you want unlimited e-mail and file transfer capability. First insert a blank 3.5 inch disk in the appropriate drive. Then press this button to make a fully functional Child copy. The automated process takes less than two minutes. The Child copy automatically inherits your site information on its address list. A FreeMail Parent or a FreeMail Call Home Parent can make unlimited Child copies. A FreeMail Extended Family Parent can Extended Child Copies. A Parent can only make Child copies that run on the same type of computer operating system.

Send To area

Press the small Down arrow to see your Address List, and select a site or group. The selected site will be the focus of the next action taken, whether it is composing a message, selecting files to send, or making modem-to-modem contact.

Delete button

Press this button to delete a highlighted message in your Message List. You can also drag and drop a message onto this button to delete it. Deleted messages are stored in a Deleted Message data base, and can be re-opened UNTIL you clear them from your system by activating Rebuild Databases in the Techie Stuff menu.

Message List area

This area is where all messages from the site and category selected in the **View area** are listed. In this example, Received messages from the site Kailash are listed. Select a message, then press the Read Mail button to open it. You can also open files in any format from this list. The small symbols show that this list includes--

- Confirmation that Certified message was opened

- Unopened compressed file

View area

The View area shows a list of sites based on the View category selected with the Floating Toolbar. In this example, the Received Mail category is selected on the Floating Toolbar, so the list shows sites from whom this site has received mail. The site **Kailash** is selected from the site list. The symbol of the full mailbox shows there is unread mail received from Kailash. A list of all mail received from Kailash is shown on the right side of the screen, in the Message List area.

Custom Cabinets

Custom Cabinets allow you to organize all your messages, sent and received, into any categories you want. Simply drag and drop a message from the Message List area onto the Custom Cabinet icon. Then assign it to an existing cabinet or make a new one in the dialog box that appears.
