FEATURES

The lobed spleenwort is also known as the pinnatifid spleenwort. It grows long, tapering, lobed leaves. Each leaf is about six inches long. It is widest at the base and tapers to a point. The evergreen leaf has a long, pointed tip which is without lobes. The leaflets are the rounded lobes of the leaf

BEHAVIORS
