"Open Stages," LCT's education program, reaches over 9,000 New York City public school students in grades 7-12 with curriculum-related projects, tickets to LCT productions and a Shakespeare collaboration with The Juilliard School. Finally, LCT publishes a journal, Lincoln Center Theater Review (formerly The New Theater Review), each issue of which explores subjects based upon Lincoln Center Theater artists or productions.

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
