Welcome to the CD WORLD application launcher, EZInstall for Windows™. We think that you will find EZInstall easy to use. However, if you need assistance or would like to know more please select a topic from the following Table of Contents.

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Quick Start

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Quick Start: Logo

When you first start EZInstall the CD WORLD company logo and information will appear. When you click "OK" to close the window, the Application List window will be displayed.

Quick Start: List

The Application List window displays all of the programs on the CD ROM title. If there are more applications than can be displayed in the window you will see a scroll bar on the right side of the display. You can scroll up and down the list of programs by moving the scroll bar with your mouse.

Quick Start: Select/Detail

To select a program, simply click on the application with the mouse to highlight your selection. If you would like more information about the program doubleclick your selection or click the "Detail" button. A pop-up window will appear with a detailed description about the program.

Quick Start: Play

Most programs are playable from the CD ROM. If a program is not playable then the "Play" button will be disabled and you will not be able to click the button. However, even if the "Play" button is enabled you may experience problems playing the application from the CD ROM. If you do have problems, please try to install the product to your harddisk and then follow any instructions for that application.

Quick Start: Install

To install the selected program, simply click the "Install" button. You will be asked what directory you would like to create. Then EZInstall will create the directory and copy the program files into that directory.

After installation of some of the products you may need to run an install or setup routine to properly install the application. Please refer to the application instructions for that product.

General Information: Menu Bar

The Menu Bar is the primary method for navigating through EZInstall. Simply click on the item you are interested in and a drop down menu will be presented listing the functions for that item. The following is a brief description of each.

File

Printer Setup: allows you select a printer and change settings

Exit: stops EZInstall

Applications

Application List: presents the programs on the CD ROM

Company

Register: how to register this title

License: CD WORLD license agreement

Technical Support: how to reach CD WORLD for support

CD WORLD Logo: displays the company logo

Previews

Volumes 1 to 30: a quick look at coming attractions

Window

Cascade: rearranges the open windows in a layered order

Tile: rearranges the open windows in a side by side order

Arrange Icons: rearranges the window icons if any are minimized

Help

Contents: presents the Table of Contents

Search for Help On: lets you look for specific topics

How to Use Help: instructions on how to use the Help system and print topics

About CD WORLD: version number, dates and other release information

General Information: Toolbar

There are three Toolbar buttons to give you additional ways of navigating EZInstall.

The first button on the right activates the Application List window.

The second button displays Technical Support and the third button presents the Help system.

General Information: Buttons

The command buttons are fairly self explanatory. Each window has a "Cancel" button to exit that window. The "Detail" button on the Application List will present a detailed description of the selected program. The "Play" button will execute the program from the CD ROM and the "Install" button will create a directory on your harddisk and copy the program files to that directory.

General Information: Help

You can get help from the Menu Bar, the Toolbar button or you can enter "Shift F1". This will display a help topic sensitive to the context that your cursor is currently positioned. That is, click on a button or other item on the window, then enter "Shift F1" to get help on that item you clicked on.

Playing from the CD

Errors

Playing from the CD: Performance

Most programs are playable from the CD ROM. If a program is not playable then the "Play" button will be disabled and you will not be able to click the button. However, even if the "Play" button is enabled you may experience problems playing the application from the CD ROM. If you do have problems, please try to install the product to your harddisk and then follow any instructions for that application.

Sometimes the product may work okay, but is just too slow. Again, install the application to your harddisk and try again. If you still have problems, please contact our [Technical Support](#).

Playing from the CD: Errors

EZInstall does not reside on your computer. The executable program and supporting files remain on the CD ROM. A Windows Application Group and Program Items are created in your Windows Program Manager to assist you in accessing the programs. Make sure that the CD ROM is in the drive before you start EZInstall. If you have problems, confirm your properties on the Program Item in Program Manager.

Installing from the CD: Directory

When you install the product you have selected, you will first be asked what directory would you like EZInstall to create. This is the directory where all of the programs and files will be copied to for that application. Each application on the CD ROM title should have its own separate directory.

Installing from the CD: File Manager

There are several different ways to execute the installed application. One would be to doubleclick on the executable program in Windows File Manager. Another would be to select Run from the File Manager menu and enter the executable name.

Installing from the CD: DOS

There are several different ways to execute the installed application. One would be to doubleclick on the executable program in Windows File Manager. Another would be to select Run from the File Manager menu and enter the executable name. Another way would be to exit Windows to DOS or select the MSDOS prompt from Windows. Then enter the executable program name at the DOS prompt.

Installing from the CD: Setup

After installing your selected application, you may still need to run an install or setup program to fully install the selected product. Please follow the instructions provided by the author of that application. Sometimes this is a text file, a word processing document, a batch file or even a Windows help system.
