The Lincoln Continental has received its first complete redesign since its debut in 1988. The new Continental, which debuted at the end of 1994, remains Lincoln's only front wheel drive entry, but for model year 1995 it has been fully restyled inside and out, with a rounder and more contemporary exterior design as well as a much softer and more integrated interior, with much-improved controls and displays. With styling resembling a four-door Mark VIII, and a modern rendition of traditional Lincoln styling cues, the new Continental is aimed at somewhat younger buyers than the carmaker's traditional offerings.

Just as importantly for 1995, Continental will also lose the dubious distinction of being the only Lincoln model not powered by a V8; the smooth and responsive 4.6-liter "modular" V8 used in the larger Town Car will also see duty in the Continental's engine compartment, with its estimated 260-HP providing much-improved performance compared to the previous car's 3.8-liter V6, and offering parity with archival Cadillac in cylinder count. Lincoln has retained and improved the Continental's innovative computer-controlled suspension system, which continues to provide a good balance between comfort and control. And the '95 Continental still offers interior space for up to six adults, along with trunk space for their golf clubs or other accouterments. Luxury features carry on the Lincoln tradition, with noteworthy additions to safety and security such as Ford Motor Company's first onboard navigation system, schedule for introduction during the '95 model year.

In 1994, the media age of Continental buyers was 64 years of age; less than 15 percent were younger than 45. About sixty percent were male.
