A Classic Updated for 1995

Porsche's evergreen 911 series, originally introduced in 1965, was given a major revision midway through 1994, introduced as an early '95 model. Porsche engineers and designers have given the 911 completely new front end sheet metal as well as an all-new rear end design, although the basic bodyshell has been retained. The 911's exterior design now uses new Porsche styling cues from the 959 concept car, with 928-like headlights, smoother front and rear bumpers, and a slightly revised interior.

An upgraded, 270-HP version of Porsche's traditional 3.6-liter flat six cylinder engine is used in normally-aspirated versions, while the 911 Turbo develops 311-HP. Also introduced for model year 1995 is a true convertible version of the new 911, replacing the former Targa versions.

Later in the model year, Porsche enthusiasts will be able to choose a twin-turbocharged 911 Turbo, featuring all wheel drive and lightweight construction. Along with the all wheel drive Turbo, a conventional Carrera 4 all wheel drive version will also be added for model year '95.

Other significant updates include an all-new multi-link rear suspension, optional limited-slip differential, and, on Cabriolets, a fully automatic soft top. With the new 911 starting at a slightly more affordable price than in previous years, Porsche seems determined to increase its visibility on the U.S. sports car scene.

Buyers of 1994 model year Porsche 911s were in their mid-forties, and over eighty percent of the principal drivers are male.
