Overview:

Toyota's Compact Pickup Grows Up

Toyota's compact pickup truck entered the 1995 model year with only minor color and trim changes. As in previous years, the pickup offers a choice of 2.4-liter, 116-HP four cylinder or 3.0-liter, 150-HP V6 engines, three trim levels, and either rear- or four-wheel drive. In order to lessen internal competition with Toyota's midsize T100 pickup, long-bed versions of the compact truck were deleted at the close of the 1993 model year.

During the spring, Toyota will fully redesign its compact pickup truck line, featuring all-new exterior sheet metal and substantial improvements to interior design. On the outside, the new truck will build on the rugged yet refined

styling of previous Toyota compact pickups, adding a somewhat more rounded look borrowed from Toyota's midsize T100 pickup. Interiors will feature all-new instrument panel design, with a driver's airbag added as standard equipment.

The new trucks are also expected to provide improved ride and handling characteristics, as well as upgraded noise comfort, setting a compact-class benchmark for overall sophistication similar to that achieved by the company's larger T100 pickup entry. Toyota will continue to offer a choice of four cylinder or V6 power, although engines will be upgraded in displacement and horsepower output. Drivetrain choices are expected to include a new, 144-HP version of the 2.4-liter four cylinder, a larger 2.7-liter four cylinder of 150-HP, and an upgraded 3.4-liter V6 of 190-HP. Four wheel drive versions will use the larger four cylinder as their standard power plant. Other significant upgrades for 1995 1/2 include a standard driver's airbag and four-wheel antillock brakes. Finally, the all-new truck will distinguish itself by using a geographic model designation from the American Northwest--Tacoma--instead of its generic 'compact pickup' designation of the past.

In 1994, the median age of 4WD Toyota compact pickup buyers was about 35; owners of 2WD versions were slightly older, at 37. Depending on model, between 80 and 85 percent of principal drivers were men.
