The clchat server is much like an irc server would be except not as complicated. A more simpler version with not as many commands and such. With the ability of multiple channels, baning, private messaging and a dcc like file sending protocol make all the most convient things of the irc avialable. Why use CLChat? Well unlike the irc there is not lagg or splits which makes for great uninterrupted converstaions.

The clchat client is much like the irc client Grapevine. The whole thing is done in MUI, but for those who hate MUI you must try this program as the author does very well with MUI. With keyboard short

cuts, and many config options make it pleasurable to use. A not as nice but usable Windows version is available for use on IBM PC's.

By combining a multitude of commodities into a single package this program offers a great deal of speed and versatility. The program runs flawlessly and is very easy to install. There are some functions that this program provides that I have not seen available anywhere else, such as:

AssignWedge - This nice feature enhances the "Please insert ??? in any drive" requester so now you are able to Assign (Requester for selection), Mount (Tries to mount the requested device), Deny (always cancels the requester before popups it at any time)

ScreenActivation - If a new screen comes to front, it will always be activated. The last time activated Window will be, of course, activated.

Toolalias - Here you can exchange the Icon-Defaulttool. Give a pattern and the new command. (e.g. more to c:ppmore)

Just to name a few...

When it comes to commodities and MCP is the only commodity you REALLY need...
