1.2 Opening words

Welcome to SceneXplorer2 CD!

This CD is just an ordinary collection of scene products... Wait a moment! It's not the truth. It's not another low-cost item on the market, there's something more here! Preparing this collection we've tried to make a compilation able to let you delete most part of the scene stuff from your hard disk. You'll find everything connected with the scene on the CD. Demos, intros, 2D and 3D gfx, music modules, as well as disk magazines, slideshows, music-disks and ASCII collections. Of course all the needed programs are included too. Most of them are SHAREWARE, so we suggest you to register as soon as possible. Moreover, we're giving you the newest version of the great AHI packet and the best multichannel tracker - DigiBoosterPro!

All hand-drawn graphics are in PNG format, image processing and 3D graphics in JPEG format. Modules were packed using Xpk SQSH. Demos, mags, slideshows and music-disk were archived with LZX. All this allowed us to put more than 1GB of data on the CD! However, it doesn't mean that our main purpose was to achieve the largest possible quantity. Quality is the most important! Believe us, it was really hard to put all these great products on one single CD.

Unfortunately, not everything went fine. Some worse products had to be put on the CD too. Why? It's obvious: because they won several parties! It's not our fault. People often vote in a very strange way. We just wanted to have most of the winning demos, intros, graphics and mods.

For the ones less familiar with the mysteries of Workbench we have enclosed the A-Start utility. Thanks to this program you'll be able to play a module, display a picture, unarchive and run a demo, intro etc. without making big efforts. We also recommend the small utility called Odpalacz. This one has been written especially for SX2. It's similar to A-Start, but it's far easier to configure and takes less space in the memory. Odpalacz shows its real advantages when used with AmigaGuide documents. Just enter

1.3 Features

Features:

 - over 1GB of packed data;
 - everything compressed to the maximum;
 - CD is 100% full;
 - clear and functional data structure;
 - readable name standard maintained;
 - the smallest possible number of different file formats;
 - bilingual documentation (English + Polish);

- all of the demos, slideshows, music-disks, mags and packs work without any problems just after unpacking;
- package of useful utilities included;
- simplicity of usage;

1.5 Remarks

Authors' remarks:

- SceneXplorer2 has been prepared for the owners of so called 'better configurations'. Suggested minimum is: A1200, 030/50, FPU, 10 Mb Ram, HDD, CD-Rom :). We recommend 060, gfx and music card and a good monitor;
 - you should copy all the files from system directories on the CD to the proper directories on your HDD, so that running 'Assigns' script every time you insert SX2 will not be necessary;
 - complete archives with the tools used on the CD can be found in 'Tools/!Archived' directory;
 - if you notice the file called 'ABC' appears after unpacking the archive, you should use it to run this production;
 - if an artist changed his nickname, we've put his products in one common directory;
 - some of the products on the CD don't have their original names. Unfortunately we wasn't able to contact their authors, therefore we were forced to invent the names ourselves. Please don't laugh and don't be angry; :)
 - due to lack of free space, we have been forced to include only two last issues of mags and packs;
 - the cover was fully developed on Amiga. If you need good quality cover for your product, but you wouldn't like to spend a fortune on it, don't

hesitate to contact us!

1.7 Unpacking an LZX archive

Unpacking an LZX archive:

- enter Devices menu in A-Start or run Odpalacz from Tools directory;
- display the contents of SceneXplorer2 CD;
- find the proper file;
- in case of A-Start click and hold left mouse button on a small icon symbolising the file, then choose 'Unpack to DH0:' or 'Unpack to RAM:';
- in case of Odpalacz just double-click on the filename, then show the program directory you want to unpack the archive to;

- enter Devices menu in A-Start or run Odpalacz from Tools directory;
 - display the contents of SceneXplorer2 CD;
 - find the proper file;
 - just click on its filename;

Running a demo, intro, music-disk, slideshow, magazine:

- enter Devices menu in A-Start or run Odpalacz from Tools directory;
- display the contents of SceneXplorer2 CD;
- find the proper file;
- in case of intros just click on the filename. Demos, music-disks, slideshows, mags and packs need to be
unpacked
first;
- if you're not able to start a product, try to boot without Startup-sequence. Attention! Always remember to run SetPatch.
